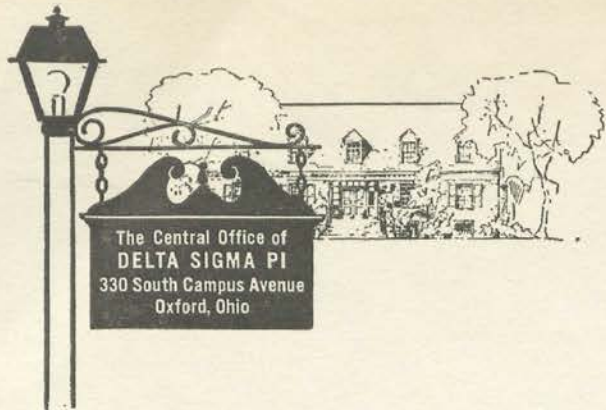



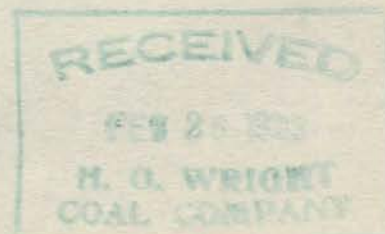

We have received the formal petition of the Deltasig Club at the University of Mo; Columbus, Mo. comprising 20 members who have organized for the express purpose of petitioning Delta Sigma Pi. Brother H. G. Wright will make a trip of investigation just as soon as possible and report fully, but in the meantime we are advising you of the status of this matter to give you as much time for investigation as you desire.

This group was organized by Brother Wright in the following manner: Through some correspondence with the Dean of the School it developed that Alpha Kappa Psi who have been in Missouri for several years, had just about ceased to function. The Dean had heard of our organization and after some correspondence with Brother Wright, sent him the names of several high grade men, who, in his opinion would be really interested in our work, if a chapter was organized, would perpetuate the existence of the same at Missouri. Negotiations were opened with these men a couple of months or so ago, and the result is now the Deltasig Club, with 20 members. Missouri is a state institution pretty well regarded in the West.
