To whom it may concern:

Having just completed my 15th year on the faculty of the School of Business of Francis Marion University, I speak about the needs of our business students with a deep understanding. I believe strongly that a Delta Sigma Pi Chapter at our school would benefit our School of Business students in three key areas: individual development, acquiring leadership skills, and learning about the corporate world. In addition, I see a Delta Sigma Chapter as being a key to motivating stronger faculty participation in this process of responding to our student's needs in these social-professional areas.

Our students come to us with varied levels of both academic achievement and social-professional skills. Most of the work of our faculty focuses on raising the level of academic achievement of our students so they will meet the requirements for our bachelor of business degree in one of the business disciplines. Many of our faculty devotes some effort to helping our students develop the social-professional skills needed to succeed in the business environment, and fortunately we are blessed with a few faculty members who excel in moving students forward in this area. However, overall we fall short of meeting the needs of our students in this area of developing social-professional skills.

A. Introduction

Francis Marion University (FMU) is one of South Carolina's 12 state-supported universities. As one of the state's six comprehensive institutions, FMU prides itself on providing a strong liberal arts education. The University has nearly 4,000 students enrolled. The University offers a broad range of undergraduate degrees and a select number of graduate programs in serving the needs of communities, businesses and industries of the Pee Dee region. Francis Marion is the only state university serving the Pee Dee region, and many of its students are the first in their families to attend college.

FMU has the look and feel of a small, liberal arts college with all the benefits of a state-supported comprehensive university. FMU offers an excellent learning environment, small enough to afford students personalized attention from faculty and staff, and large enough to let students expand their horizons.

Francis Marion University is fully accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) to award Bachelor and Master's level degrees. The university is approved by the S.C. State Board of Education and is a member of the American Council on Education and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. A number of FMU's individual academic programs have also been accredited by specialized agencies.

B. History

Francis Marion University was founded in response to an overwhelming need for a public higher education institution in the Pee Dee region of South Carolina. The university was founded in 1970 and named in honor of Revolutionary War hero, General Francis Marion, who was nicknamed the Swamp Fox for using the South Carolina terrain to out-fox the British.

However, the university can trace its history to 1957 when the University of South Carolina (USC) established a freshman center at the Florence County Library. In 1961, a permanent campus for USC-Florence was established seven miles east of Florence on land donated by the Wallace family, the current location of FMU.

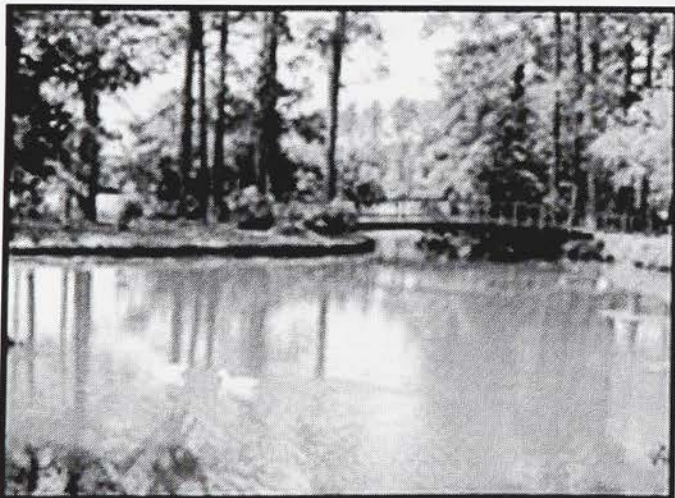
By 1966, enrollment at USC-Florence had reached 350, and community leaders began a movement to establish a four-year institution to better meet the educational needs of the area. Following a Commission on Higher Education recommendation, Gov. Robert E. McNair signed into law an act creating Francis Marion College, effective July 1, 1970. The institution gained university status in 1992.

Located about seven miles east of Florence, the 300-acre campus is known for its beautiful foliage and landscaping. The campus includes 100 acres of mixed pine-hardwood and bottomland forests accessed by a series of trails. Several acres have been set-aside as an Arboretum that is being developed into a resource with many of the native species of the area.

History of Sigma Beta Pi Colony

Mary Dittman who is an Instructor of Marketing at Francis Marion and a member of Delta Sigma Pi encouraged the idea of a chapter at the school. In February 2004, Dale Clark- Director of Chapter and Expansion Services visited the students and encouraged them to pursue a charter. The Sigma Beta Pi colony was excited about this opportunity and strived to meet the necessary requirements through community service activities, professional activities and fundraisers. The executive meetings and general meetings were held every Wednesday in the School of Business. Since the colony's pursuit for a charter, Shaunda Prince- Regional Director and Karin Grant- Educational and Leadership Consultant, who both inspired and encouraged us in our endeavor, have visited us. The Sigma Beta Pi colony of Delta Sigma Pi will be chartered in fall of 2005.
