

It is my distinct privilege and pleasure to recommend that the Delta Sigma Pi colony at California Lutheran University's School of Management be elevated to Chapter status. Delta Sigma Pi's mission to foster the study of business and professional development for its members fits well with Cal Lutheran's mission to "develop leaders for a global society" who are "committed to service and justice," and with the School's mission to "prepare students for success with integrity in their professional and personal lives." We have already seen evidence of our colony's contribution to that mission.

The colony has been an excellent example of student leadership. The brainstorm of a small group of students working together while on a short-term study trip in China, the idea spread to the current leadership team, and the group began the process of formalizing its connections to Delta Sigma Pi and to the University's organizational structures.

Soon after getting those processes under way, the students organized a kickoff meeting with an excellent guest speaker from the local industry, and announced the results of its first fund-raising effort in a walk for Alzheimer's disease, raising over \$1000. University History

California Lutheran University Colony Section III. University History Founding & Major Development

The Founding

In 1954, a committee was first formed jointly by the American Lutheran Church and the Lutheran Church of America (These two organizations much later joined with another organization to become the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.) to plan the development of a Lutheran college in California. Five churches served on the committee, dubbed the California Lutheran Education Foundation, which still owns the university. Richard Pederson, son of Scandinavian immigrants, donated 130 acres of farmland for the university in 1957.

In 1959, the college was officially incorporated, with Orville Dahl Ed. D. instituted as the first president. The college opened to its first incoming class in September 1961, and was accredited by the Western Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools in March 1962. Dahl served as president until 1962, bringing the university's first football coach, Robert Shoup, to the campus in his final year.

CLU grew in size, and in debt, steadily through the 1960s. In 1970, the college was \$3,600,000 in debt and predicted to go bankrupt. However, belt tightening by the school and enrollment increases pushed finances into the black by the end of the year. Fates turned around further when the school won its first, and only, NAIA football championship, in 1971.

In the 1980s, the school began expanding at a rapid pace; with major construction of new buildings and renovations underway. In 1986, the school was renamed California Lutheran University to reflect the addition of graduate programs.

In 1994, KCLU was created and housed on the Cal Lutheran campus.

Several notable teams have trained on the campus. The Dallas Cowboys, a NFL team, trained there from 1963 to 1989. After the Samuelson Aquatic Center was completed in 2007, it served as the official training site of the 2008 and 2012 US Olympic Men's Water Polo teams. Other notable visitors to CLU events include Ronald Reagan in 1979; Bob Hope in 1984; and the President of Nicaragua Violeta Barrios de Chamorro in 1991.

Major Development & Growth Events

Since its founding, California Lutheran University has grown into a highly regarded university that attracts undergraduate and graduate students from all over the United States as well as international students from 61 different countries. Currently, California Lutheran University contains a total of 4,126 students, 2,810 and 1,316 of them undergraduate and graduate respectively. California Lutheran University prides themselves on their academic rigor

as well as their ability to educate leaders for a global society who are strong in character, confident in their identity and vocation, and committed to service and philanthropy.

California Lutheran University has also been expanding to other regions of Los Angeles. One of California Lutheran University's most recent major developments is the establishment of the Entrepreneurship Center in Westlake Village and their Woodland Hills campus location. Each of these new major developments have a team of individuals who focus on expanding California Lutheran University's name across Los Angeles as well as nationally/internationally, host exceptional professional speaker events for people in the community to attend, and host several MBA courses for long-distance commuters. On top of their expansion of satellite locations, California Lutheran University has hired 5-7 new professors who are focusing on growing the business department as well as implementing a new entrepreneurship minor for CLU students to take who are majoring in other non-business majors such as STEM.

Overall, California Lutheran University prides themselves on their growth over the last decade. California Lutheran University is rapidly climbing the ranks as one of the best regional liberal arts universities in the West Coast. Ten years ago, California Lutheran University was ranked below 30 in the west coast but as of 2015, California Lutheran University earned the ranking of 16th, which was posted on colleges.usnews.rankingsandreviews.com/.

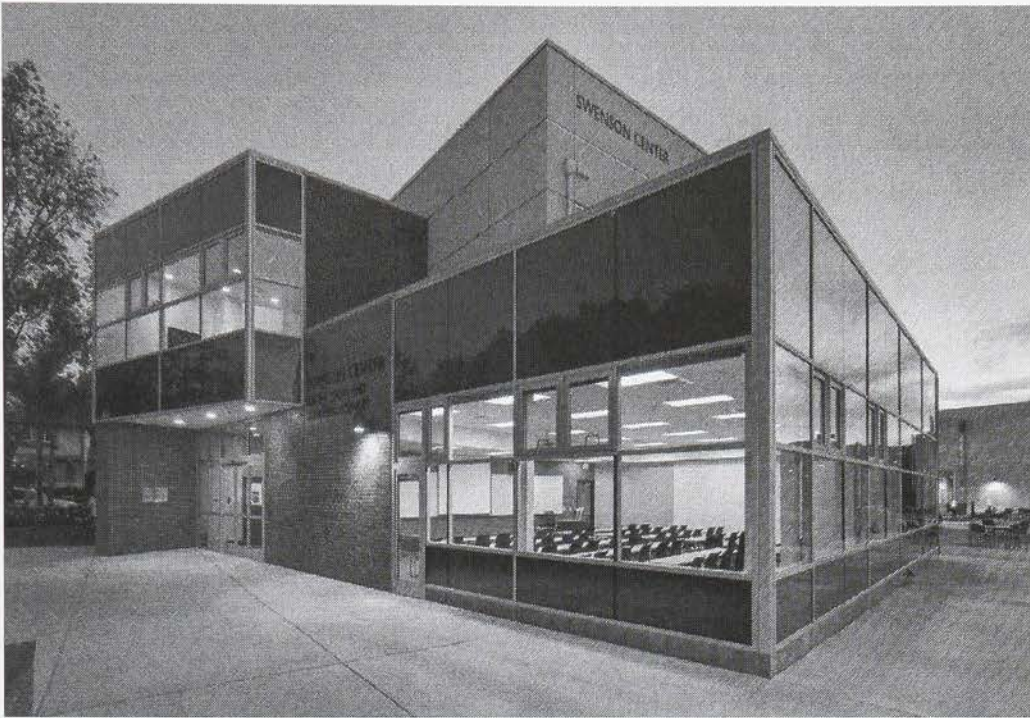

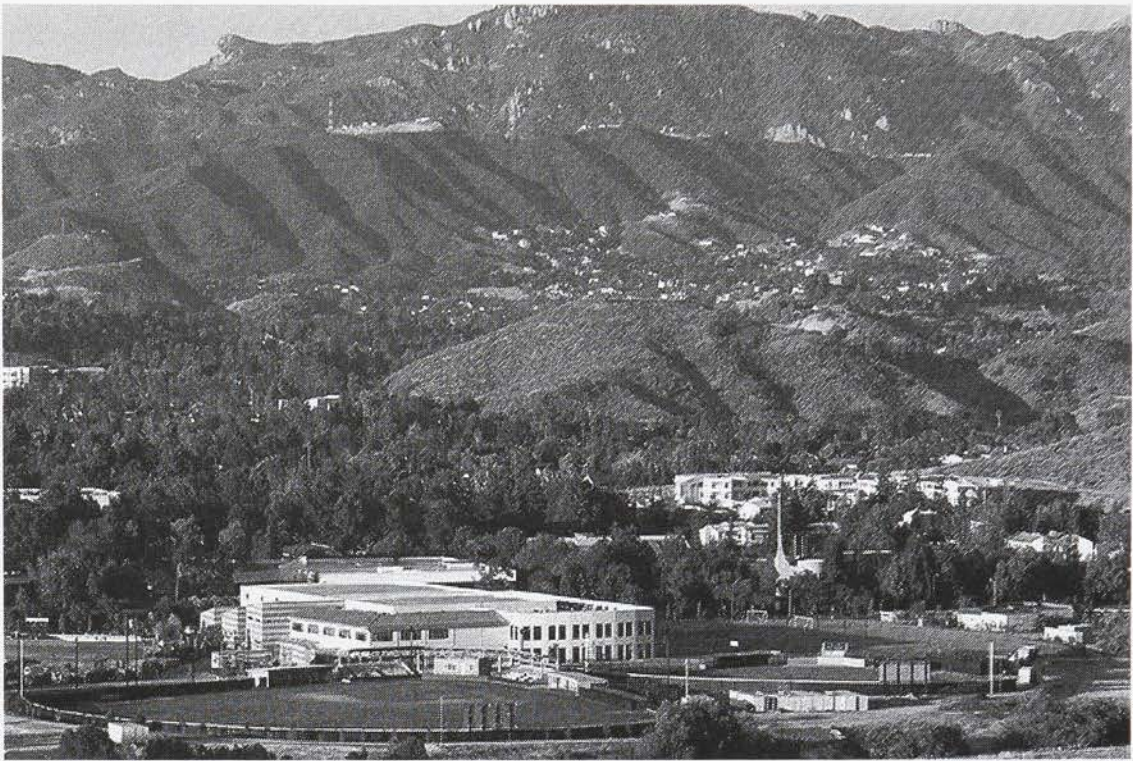

School of Management

HISTORY

California Lutheran College was established in 1959 as it was formally incorporated. The name was officially changed to California Lutheran University in 1986.

The School of Management was established at the time of the University's opening in 1959. CLU and its programs have gained accreditation from the Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). The School of Management boasts a faculty size of 127, which includes a mix of permanent faculty, along with assistant professors, and adjunct faculty members. One important faculty member being the current Dean of the School of Management, Gerhard Apfelthaler, of whom is also a tenured professor in International Business at CLU.

The School of Management offers 3 majors: Accounting (B.S), Business Administration (B.S.), and Economics (B.A.). The Business Administration major also offers 9 concentrations to choose from. There are 5 minors offered, which are Business Administration, Economics, Entrepreneurship, International Business, and Sports Management. There is also the Bachelor's Degree designed specially for working professionals, in accounting, business management, and organizational leadership. For 2015, there was a total of 519 students enrolled in the school of management.

Aside from the undergraduate programs offered, there are also graduate programs. CLU offers a Masters in Business Administration (MBA) for postgraduate students, along with an MBA for Experienced Professionals, a Full-Time MBA for international students, MBA in Europe, MBA in financial planning, and post MBA certificates. There is the 4+1 option, where undergraduates can start their graduate program their senior year and finish their MBA in just one year after their undergraduate is completed. Besides MBAs, there is also a Master of Science (M.S.) in Information Technology and in Quantitative Economics offered, along with a Master of Public Policy and Administration offered.

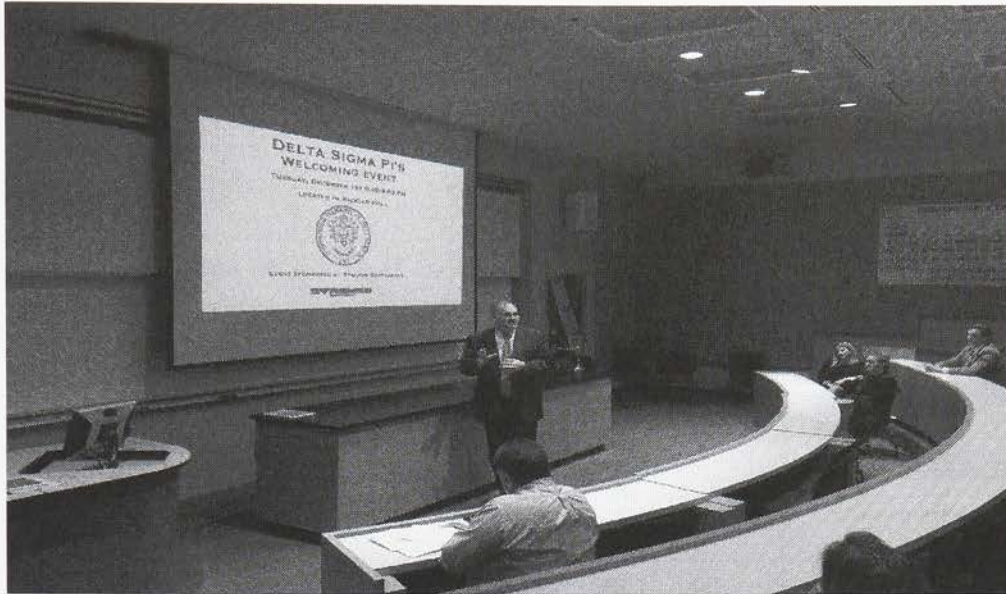

February 23, 2016

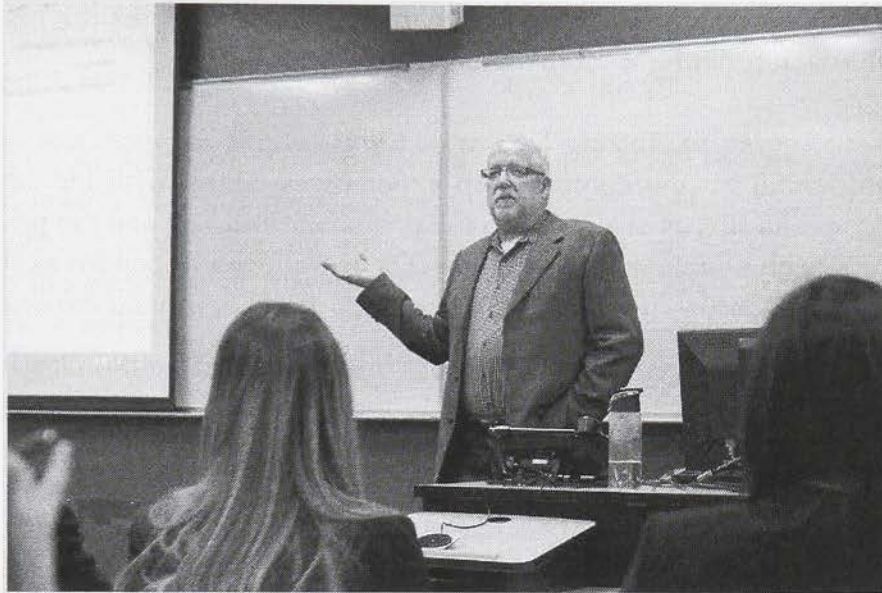

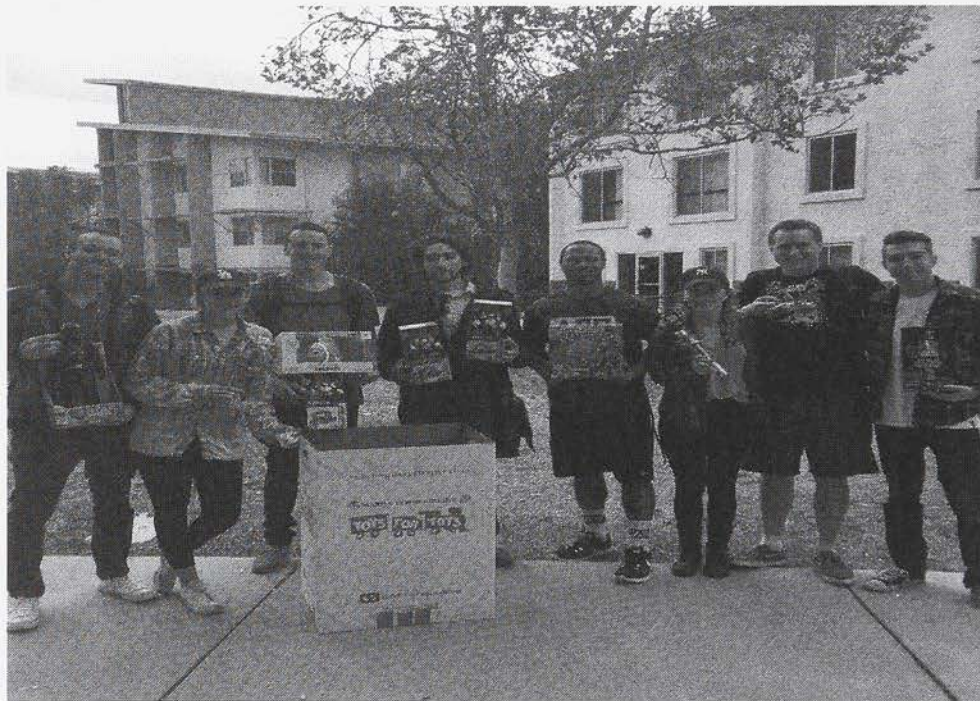

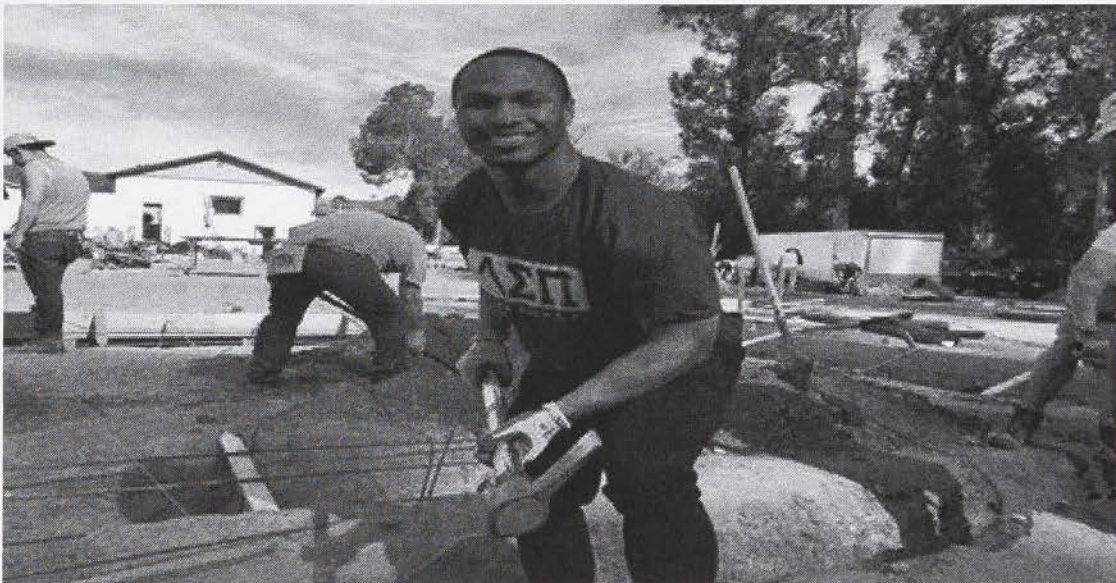
Habitat for Humanity

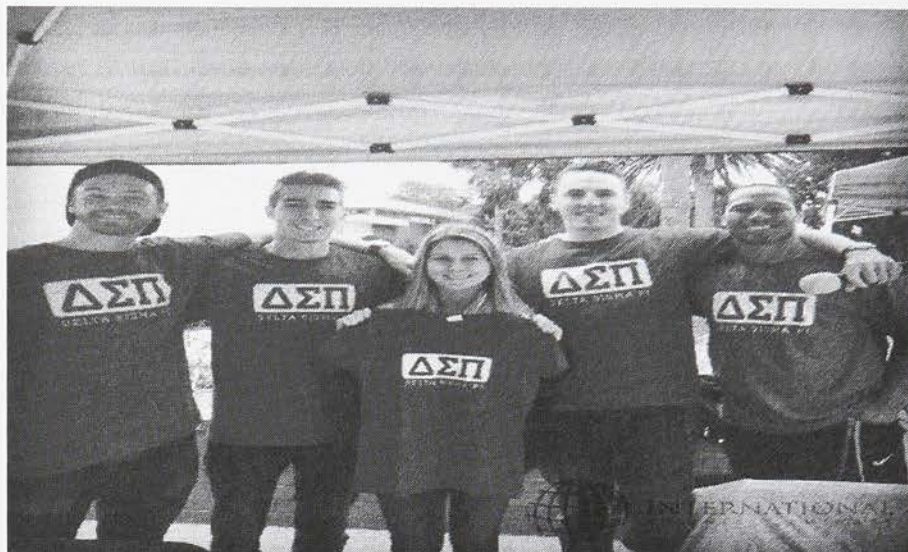

Dinner Outting

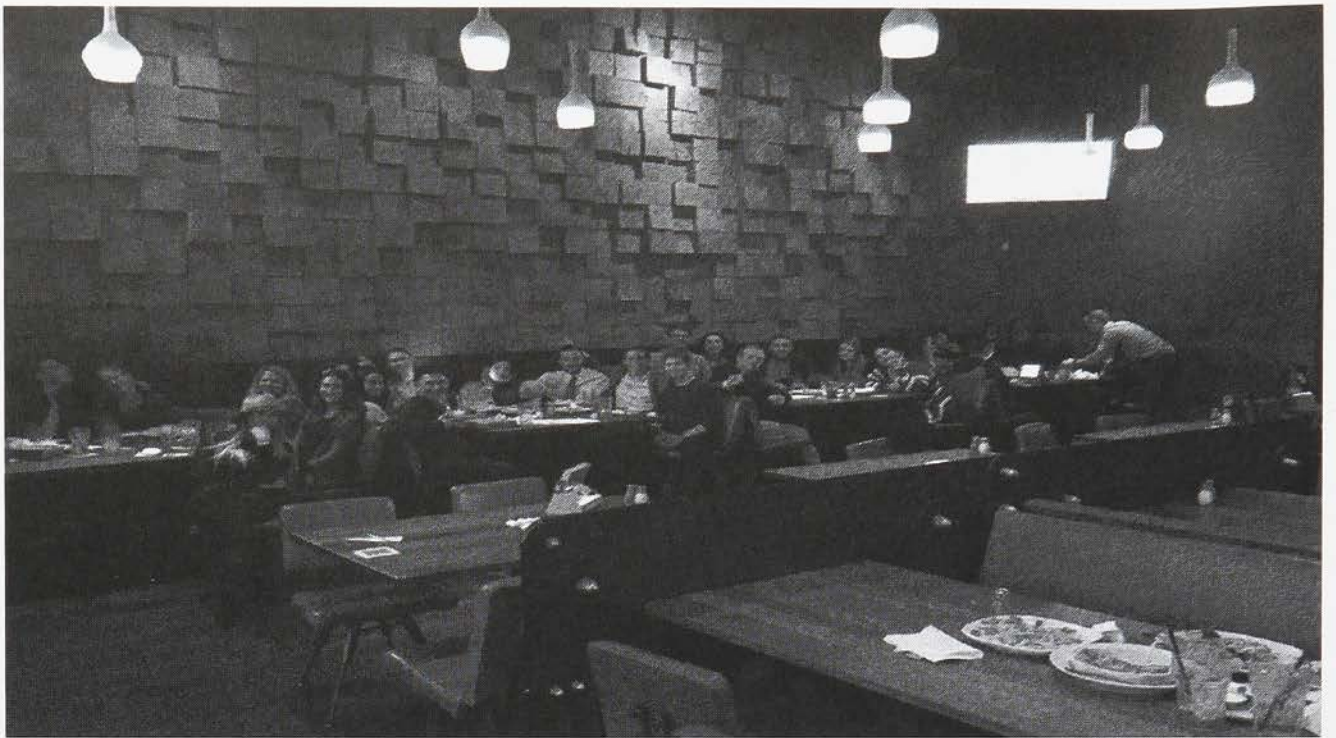

Kristen Acaya



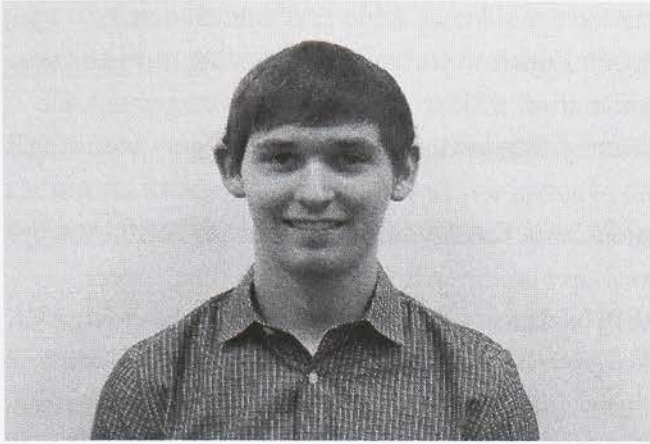
Kristen Acaya is an undergraduate student at California Lutheran University majoring in Business Administration with an emphasis in Management. She is expecting to graduate in May 2017.

Taylor Adelson

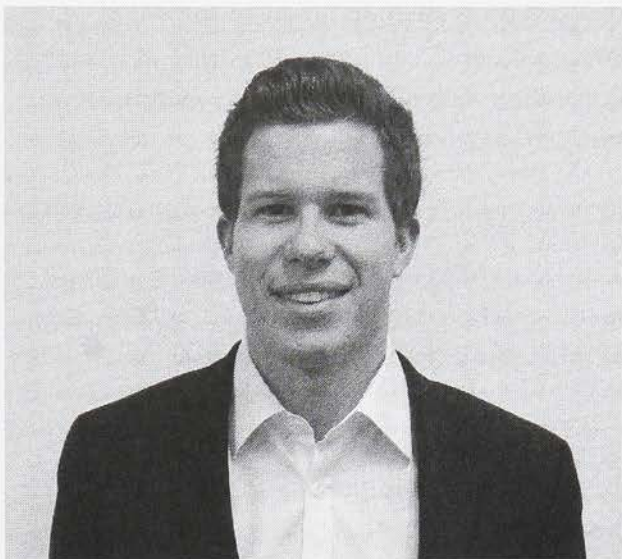


Taylor Adelson is an undergraduate student at California Lutheran University majoring in Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance. He is expecting to graduate in 2019.

Fernanda Barragan

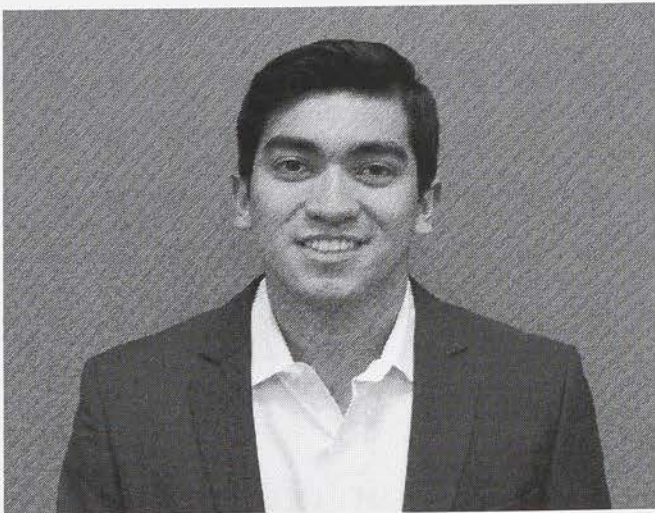

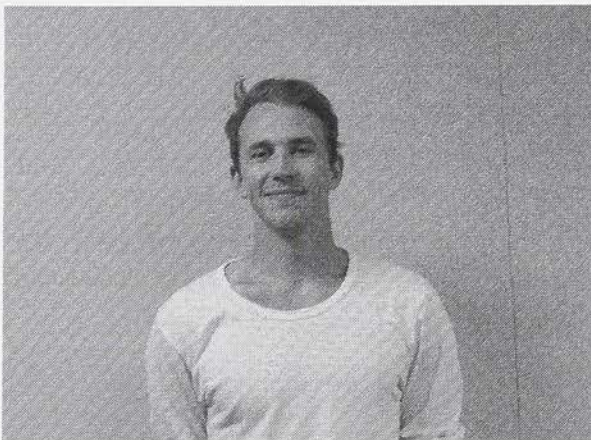

Francesca Dominguez



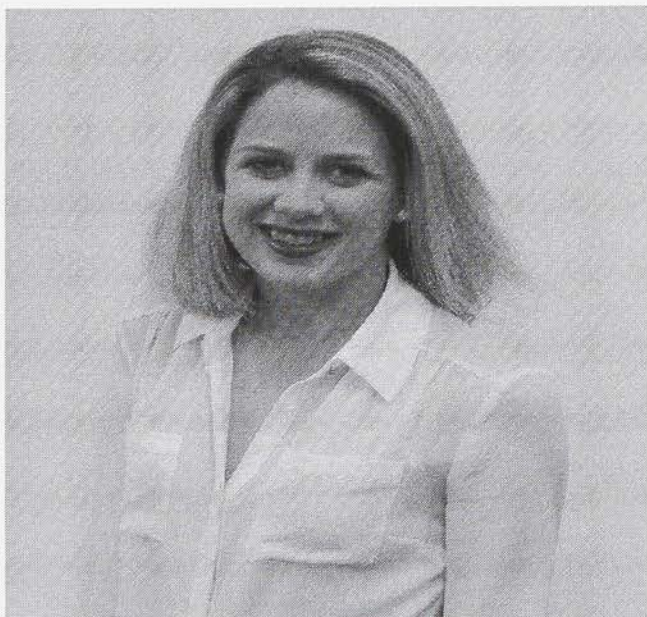

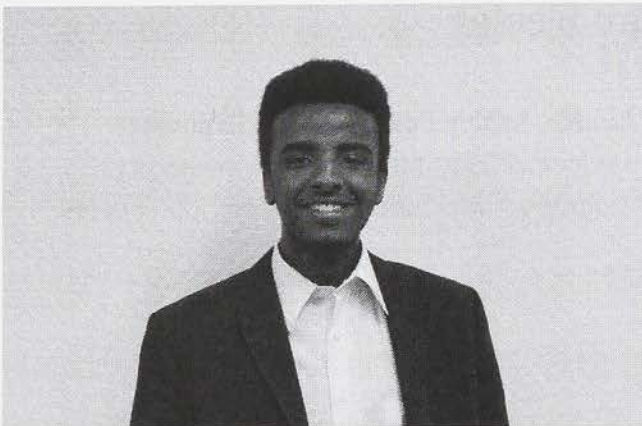

Justin Freeman

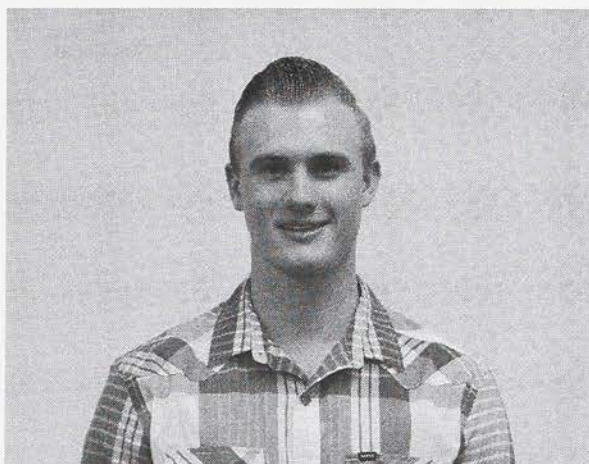

Nazanin Gholami

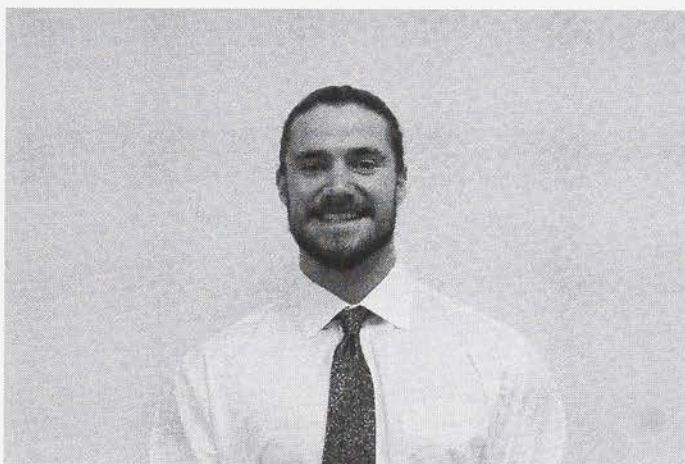
Nazanin Gholami is a student at California Lutheran University, Thousand Oaks campus. Gholami is currently an Economics major and is expected to graduate in May 2018.

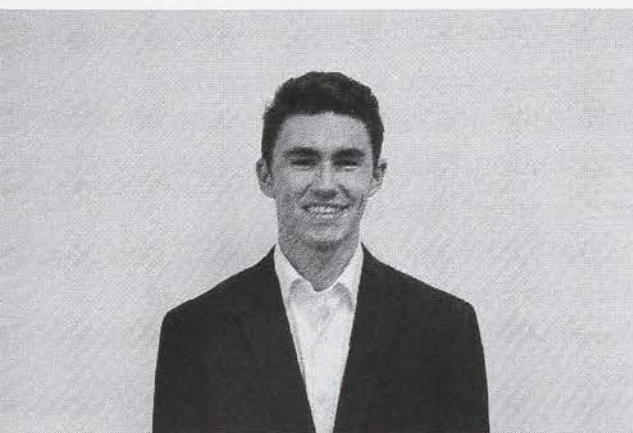

Tyler Hood is an undergraduate student at California Lutheran University majoring in Business Administration with a minor in Spanish. He is expecting to graduate in Spring 2018.

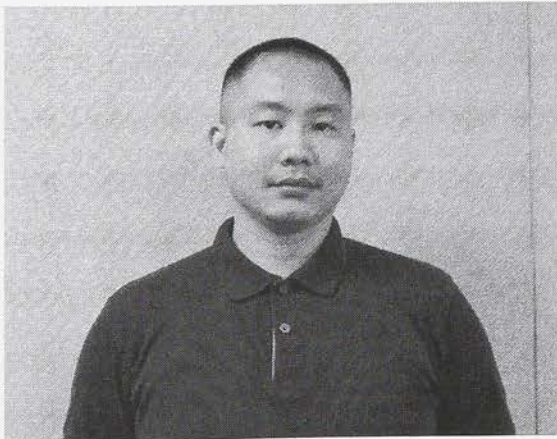
Tyler Hood was born in Long Beach, California. When he was seven years old he and his family

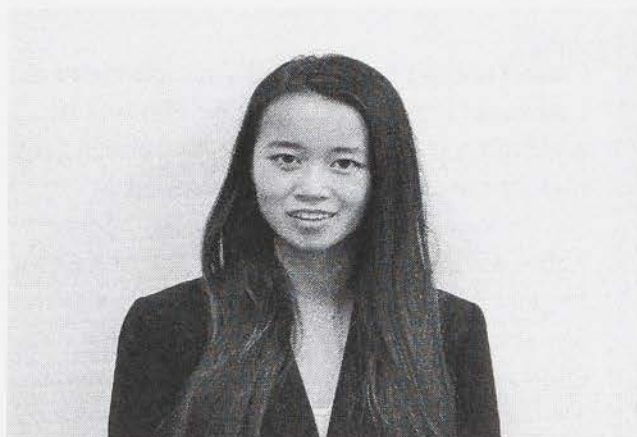

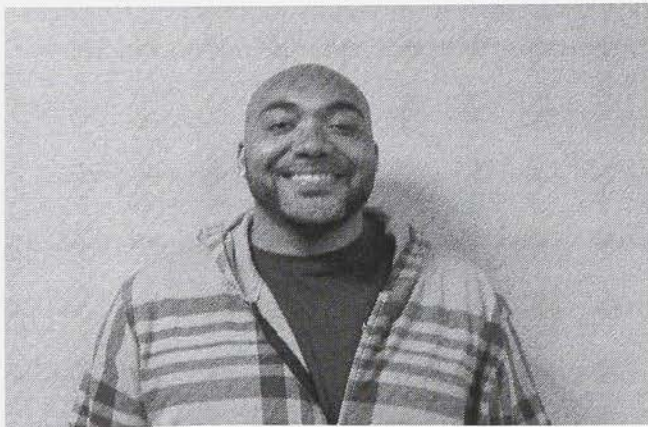

Devon Meredith



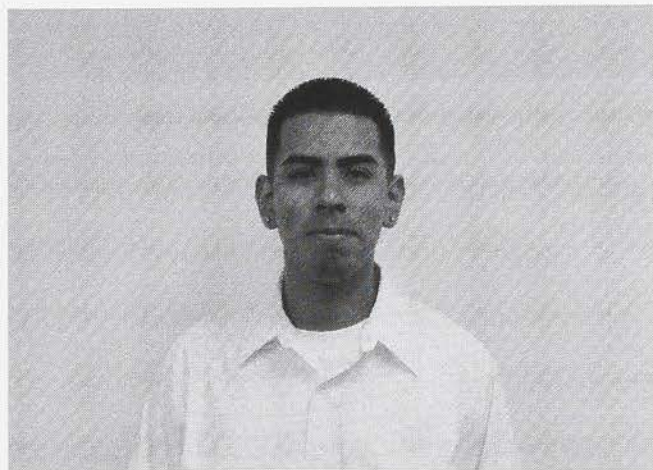
Devon P. Meredith is an undergraduate student at California Lutheran University majoring in Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance. She is expected to graduate in May 2016.

Octavio Meza



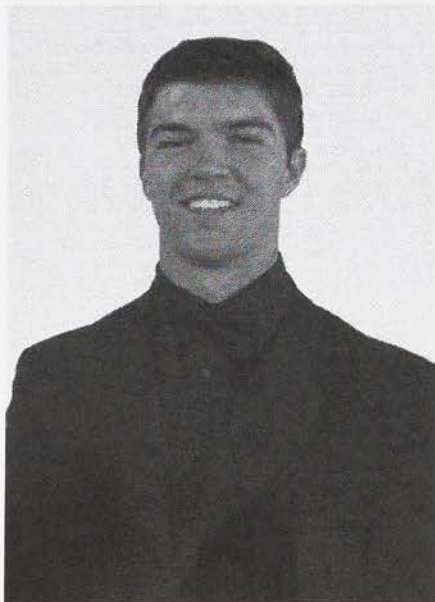

Alexandra Perez



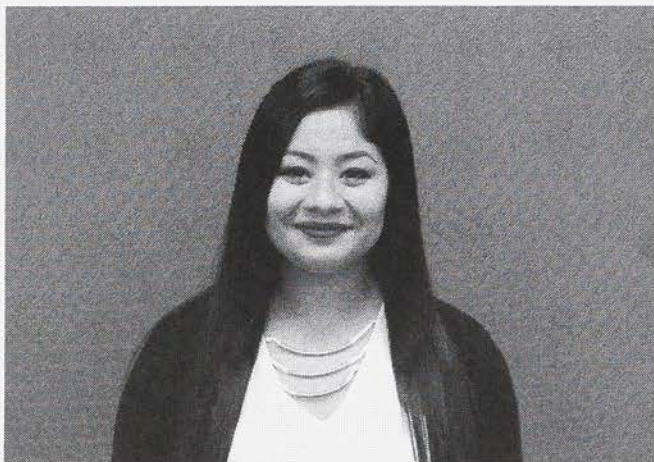

Haley Ramos



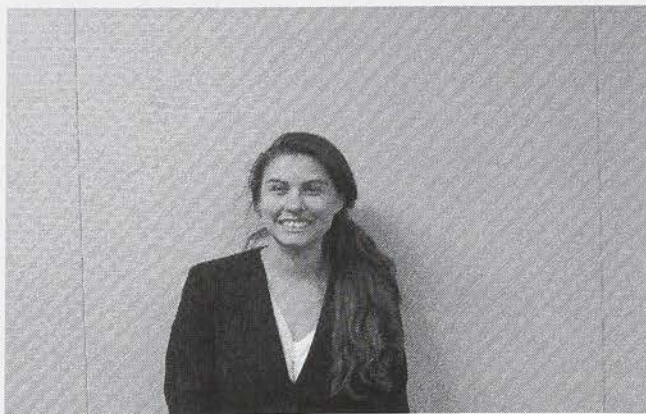
Haley Ramos is an undergraduate student at California Lutheran University majoring in Marketing Communications and minoring in Art. She is expecting to graduate in May 2016.

Logan Sanders

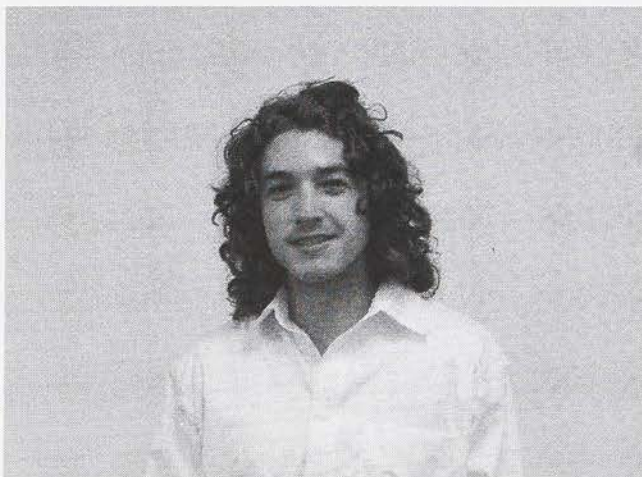

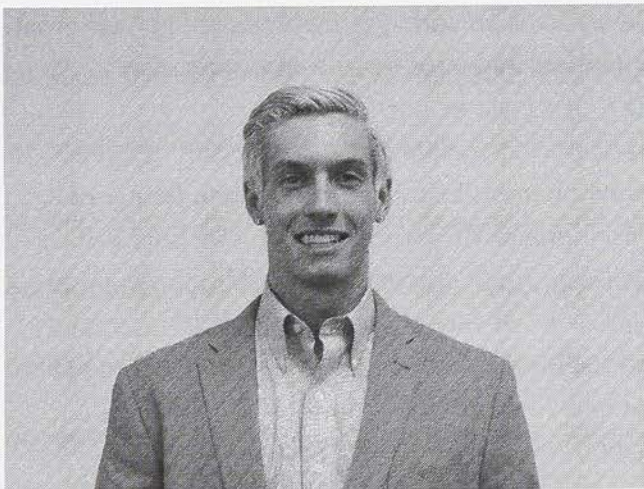

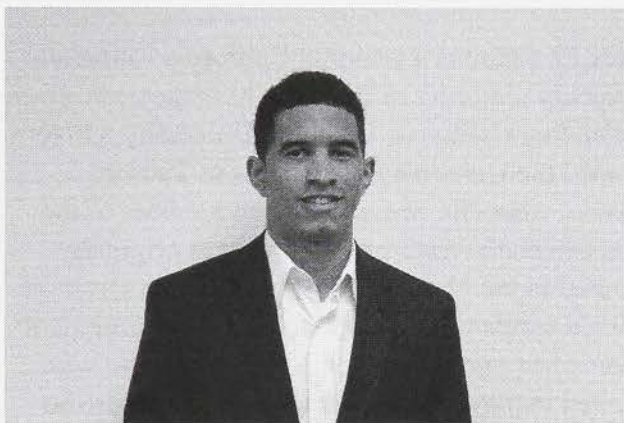
high school that she realized adapting and integrating new cultures is an enriching experience, and that her bilingual and culturally-diverse background could serve as a valuable tool in life.

In high school, Kayla was on the volleyball team for two years. In addition to playing volleyball for

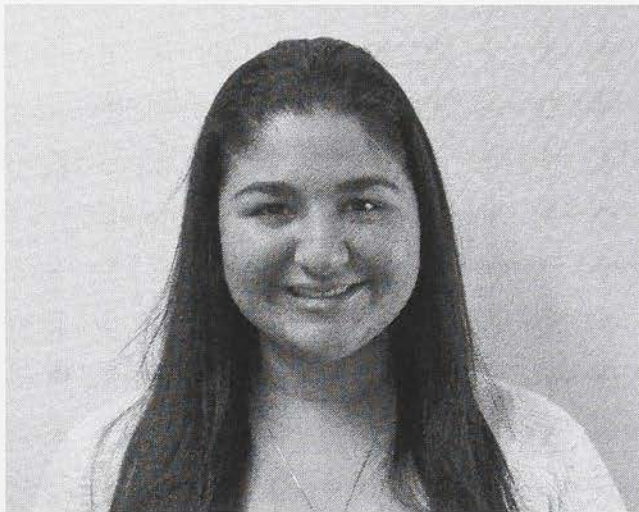

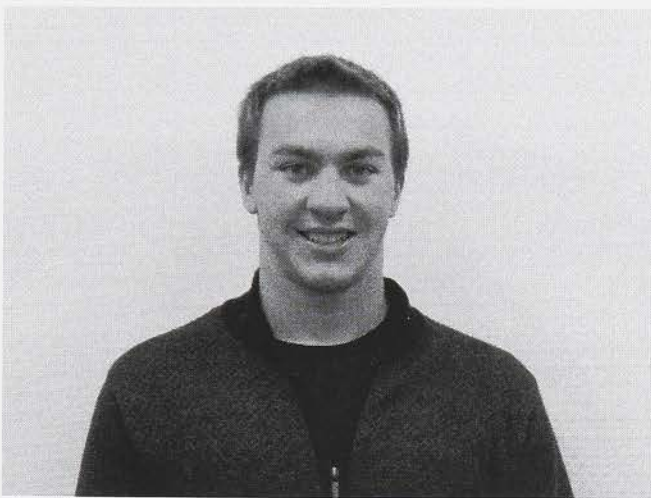
