We all know the importance of our faculty and alumni advisors to our collegiate chapters. They serve as sounding boards, mentors and good friends. They are there for the chapter through thick and thin and can always be counted on. Their interest and enthusiasm can directly affect our own interest and enthusiasm. Let's face it, individually, and as an organization, it would be difficult to get along without them. We've written about our advisors before in this column, and we discuss them many times in officer training sessions and Chapter Consultant visits. Sometimes, we forget about them and may take them for granted, but we must always be on guard to remember and thank them for their efforts on our behalf.

But I wonder if there isn't another group that we may also take for granted. This group can have an even more direct impact on our own participation. I'm talking about our parents and spouses. In many cases the attitude and understanding of your parents and spouse toward the Fraternity can directly affect your Fraternity involvement, and every your initial decision to pledge. How many sons have had to explain to their mother why your chapter won't be like Animal House? Or daughters explaining to their fathers about joining a co-ed what?! Have you encountered the cold silence from your spouse that may greet your announcement that you'll be attending another Fraternity event this weekend or evening? Or deal with the question "Did you marry me or the Fraternity?"

I suspect that we all have encountered concern, resistance or even hostility about our fraternal commitment. Because these people are the most important in our lives, it is important that we deal with their questions and frustrations about the time we devote to the Fraternity. How can we deal with these issues so that everyone is happy?

We must always strive for balance between the time we spend with the Fraternity and our family. Beyond that, involve your family with the Fraternity as much as possible. Invite them to Fraternity functions. Bring them to the initiation banquet or summer outing. Introduce them to other Deltasigs and their parent or spouses so they can feel a connection to the group. Let them experience our Fraternity as much as possible.

It may not be easy; it may not always be successful; but it will go a long way in helping them understand and appreciate why the Fraternity is important to you.



he 1991-92 academic year was one of growth for Delta Sigma Pi. Following the installation of Mu Rho Chapter at Colorado State University in December, 1991, the reactivation of Zeta Phi Chapter at Florida Atlantic University in January, 1992 (highlighted in the Spring 1992 issue), and the installation of Mu Sigma Chapter at Barry University in March, 1992, the fraternity continued its growth with the installation of three additional chapters, and the ractivation of one. Mu Tau Chapter became the sixth collegiate chapter of Delta Sigma Pi to be installed in Virginia with its installation at George Mason University. The 35th chapter of Delta Sigma Pi returned with the reactivation of Alpha Chi Chapter at Washington University in Saint Louis, Missouri, and Delta Sigma Pi saw the installation of Mu Upsilon Chapter at Baker University and the 231st collegiate chapter, Mu Phi Chapter at Saginaw Valley State University in May, 1992. These six collegiate chapters continue the growth Delta Sigma Pi has been experiencing in recent years. The hard work of the members of the colonies which were installed as our fraternity's newest chapters is a tribute to themselves and to Delta Sigma Pi. We welcome all of the members of these chapters into our Brotherhood and present their success stories to you.

Colorado State University Home of Mu Rho Chapter

The fraternity's 227 collegiate chapter and the state of Colorado's fourth came into existence on December 7, 1991, as Mu Rho Chapter was installed at Colorado State University. Forty-four collegians and two faculty members were initiated as the charter members of this chapter.

In late January, 1991, members of Alpha Rho Chapter at the University of Colorado at Boulder distributed recruiting materials and informed business students at Colorado State University about Delta Sigma Pi. Interested students attended a general information meeting, and in February, 1991, a letter was received at The Central Office from students stating their intent to establish a colony of Delta Sigma Pi at Colorado State University. Then Director of Chapter Services C. Dean Ferguson visited the Alpha Sigma Colony on April 17, 1991, and met individually with each officer. He also met with Dean Richard Pregnetter and Colony Advisor Gene Lewis. The formal pledging ceremony for Alpha Sigma Colony was held later that evening. At that time there were 21 members of the colony. In the beginning of the fall 1991 semester, the colony recruited and had pledged an additional 29 members, bringing their present membership to 50.

In August, 1991, two members of the colony attended the Grand Chapter Congress and Office Training School in Washington, D.C. On the morning of December 7, 1992, a large group of Deltasigs gathered at Colorado State University for the installation of Mu Rho Chapter. Grand President William R. Kinsella, Western Provincial Vice President Paul J. P. Garcia, Intermountain Regional Director Joseph L. Goldblatt, Chapter Consultant R. Scott Kortendick, District Director Richard C. Blevins, District Director James F. Pendergrass, and members of the Denver Alumni Chapter, Alpha Rho Chapter at the University of Colorado and Zeta Kappa Chapter at Western State College comprised the installation team.

The business department at Colorado State University started operating in the fall of 1943. Currently, over 1,300 students are enrolled in the College of Business. The degrees offered through the college are a Bachelors of Science Administration, Masters of Science, and the Masters of Business Administration. Majors include accounting and taxation, management, marketing, finance, and computer information systems. Colorado State University originated

in 1870. On September 1, 1879, the first graduate students attended the college. Since 1870, more than 100,000 degrees had been bestowed by Colorado State University. Presently, some 20,800 on campus students attend eight separate colleges plus the graduate school.

Eleventh Florida Chapter Installed at Barry University

Barry University in Miami Shores, Florida, is the home of Mu Sigma Chapter of Delta Sigma Pi, the fraternity's 228 collegiate chapter. During the installation on March 7, 1992, 26 collegians and four faculty members joined the ranks of our Brotherhood.

As is frequently the case, a student at Barry University initially contacted The Central Office of Delta Sigma Pi for information about starting a chapter. These interested students contacted several fraternities to learn more about their organizations and after a visit from Golden Council Member Charles A. Hazday, decided that they wanted to become a part of Delta Sigma Pi. In January, 1991, permission was received from Barry University to establish a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi on campus, and recruiting events were conducted throughout both January and February. In February of 1991, the name of Beta Upsilon Colony was chosen and officers were elected.

In March of 1991, then Director of Chapter Services C. Dean Ferguson visited the colony. At this visit, a calendar of activities was developed and ideas to enhance the colony's fall recruiting were discussed. Dean Ferguson also had meetings with Dr. Lloyd D. Elgart, Dean of the Andreas School of Business, and Chapter Advisor Elliott Ser.

Two members of the colony attended the Grand Chapter Congress and Officer Training School in Washington, D.C., and the colony maintained a full schedule of activities in the fall of 1991. During the fall and spring semesters, the members of Beta Upsilon Colony fulfilled the requirements for a chapter charter.

Deltasigs from throughout the Southern Province, and nationwide, gathered in Miami Shores, Florida, on March 7, 1992, for the installation of Mu Sigma Chapter at Barry University. Grand President William R. Kinsella served as Headmaster for the Ritual team. Other members of the installation team included Executive Director Michael J. Mazur, Jr., Southern Provincial Vice President Richard B. Featherston, South Atlantic Regional Director Ronald W. Richards, Regional Director Jeffrey S. Fizer, Regional Director Donna M. Smith, Regional Director Robert F. Yoakum, Jr., District Directors Heather A. Bailey, Darrel T. Logullo, James A Saccullo, and B. Todd Whisenant, and Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Fund Trustee Charles A. Hazday. In addition, members of the South Florida Alumni Chapter, Beta Omega Chapter at the University of Miami, Gamma Lambda Chapter at Florida State University, Epsilon Rho Chapter at the University of Tampa, Zeta Phi Chapter at Florida Atlantic University and Kappa Pi Chapter at the University of North Florida were in attendance.

The Andreas School of Business offers majors in Accounting, Economics/Finance, Hospitality Management, Management Informations Systems, and Marketing. In 1989, 242 bachelor degrees were awarded in Business. Barry University is an independent co-educational catholic institution of higher education.

Founded in 1940, the university is sponsored by the Dominican Sisters of Adrian, Michigan, with a dedication to offer a quality education, assure a religious dimension and provide community service and presence in a more caring environment. Barry University is the largest as well as the oldest catholic university in the state of Florida.

Mu Tau Chapter Installed

On Saturday, April 11, 1992, the fraternity's 229th chapter was installed as Mu Tau Chapter at George Mason University at Fairfax, Virginia. Mu Tau Chapter is the sixth chapter established in the state of Virginia, and is a part of the Northern Province. Initial interest in establishing a chapter at George Mason University was generated after then Director of Chapter Services C. Dean Ferguson, and members of Iota Kappa Chapter at James Madison University, visited the campus in August, 1991. After several informational meetings, a letter of intent from 27 interested students was sent to The Central Office in October.

Business meetings were held throughout the fall semester, and a full schedule of professional, social, fundraising and community service activities were held. C. Dean Ferguson visited the colony again in January, 1992, and a pledging ceremony was scheduled for mid-February.

On the morning of April 11, 1992, a large group of Deltasigs gathered at George Mason University for the installation of Mu Tau Chapter. Grand President William R. Kinsella, Executive Director Michael J. Mazur, Jr., Northern Provincial Vice President Frederick C. Lipsey, Southern Provincial Vice President Richard B. Featherston, Mideastern Regional

Director Michael J. Spadaro, District Director Tamara E. Winfrey, and members of Mu Chapter at Georgetown University, Iota Kappa Chapter at James Madison University, and Iota Rho Chapter at Howard University comprised the installation team.

George Mason University originally opened in 1957, with an enrollment of seventeen students. Today, over 20,000 students attend the university, majoring in nearly 100 degree programs. The School of Business Administration offers a Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting, Decision Sciences, Finance, General Business Administration, Management, and Marketing. George Mason University has established the highest undergraduate admission requirements of any business school in the state of Virginia, and current enrollment in the business school totals over 3,000 students.


Delta Sigma Pi Returns to Washington University

Since Alpha Chi Chapter became inactive during the 1953-54 academic year, many Deltasigs have harbored a desire to again have our professional fraternity represented at Washington University. On April 25, 1992, that desire became reality as 32 new collegiate members were initiated and the charter of Alpha Chi Chapter was reactivated on the campus of Washington University in Saint Louis, Missouri.

During the spring of 1991 a student at Washington University contacted The Central Office to gather information about Delta Sigma Pi. This individual learned of the fraternity from his sister, an initiate of Gamma Chapter at Boston University.

An invitation was issued to two professional business fraternities to visit Washington University and make presentations about their organizations. Midwestern Regional Director Karen Winter attended this event along with other Deltasigs from the Saint Louis area. The students and faculty at Washington University selected Delta Sigma Pi and recruiting efforts began almost immediately. Permission to reacitvate the chapter was given to the fraternity in August of 1991. The colony had already submitted a letter of intent in May of 1991 and had selected the colony name of Sigma Lambda Mu. An organizational meeting was held in the fall of 1991, and officers of the colony were elected. Additional recruiting efforts were made during the fall, and frequent assistance was provided to the colony. Then Director of Chapter Services C. Dean Ferguson visited the colony in October, 1991. Professional events, community service activities, fund raising events, and social events were conducted throughout the fall semester.

On April 25, 1992, many Deltasigs gathered for the reactivation of Alpha Chi Chapter. Among them were members of the reactivation team: Grand President William R. Kinsella, Mid-American Provincial Vice President Randy L. Hultz,



Midwestern Regional Director John M. Callahan, Gulf South Regional Director Jeb L. Bertolasi, Then Director of Chapter Services C. Dean Ferguson, and District Directors Marlow B. Kee and Karen A. Winter. In addition, these Brothers were joined by Alpha Beta Chapter at the University of Missouri-Columbia, Eta Nu Chapter at the University of Missouri-Saint Louis, Lambda Omega Chapter at Quincy College and the Saint Louis Alumni Chapter.

The 32 new members of Alpha Chi Chapter will now work to restore Delta Sigma Pi to a position of prominence at Washington University.

Mu Upsilon Installed at Baker University

On Saturday, May 2, 1992, the fraternity's 230th chapter was installed as Mu Upsilon Chapter at Baker University at Baldwin, Kansas. On that date, collegiate and alumni Brothers from chapters in the Mid-American Province joined Grand President William R. Kinsella, Executive Director Michael J. Mazur, Jr., Mid-American Provincial Vice President Randy L. Hultz, Midwestern Regional Director John M. Callahan, and District Director Bradley J. Wirths to assist with the installation of the chapter. Joining them were members of Iota Chapter at the University of Kansas, Alpha Beta Chapter at University of Missouri-Columbia, Iota Omicron Chapter at Central Missouri State University, and Kansas City Alumni Chapter.

In February, 1991, Dr. Stuart Dorsey, a 1971 initiate of Alpha Eta Chapter and the Chairman of the Department of Economics, introduced the idea of a business organization on the Baker University campus. After several discussions, an informal meeting was arranged for interested members. Dr. Dorsey contacted The Central Office of Delta Sigma Pi to obtain information on the possibility of starting a chapter at Baker University. In early April, 1991, members of the Iota Chapter at the University of Kansas shared their experiences as Delta Sigma Pi members. It was at this time that Delta Sigma Pi became the fraternity of choice for the interested student at Baker University. In late April, an executive committee was elected and Dr. Stuart Dorsey was appointed Chapter Advisor. The name of Beta Upsilon Colony was chosen and two members of the colony attended Grand Chapter Congress and Officer Training School in Washington, D.C. The new colony completed a full schedule of activities during

the fall of 1991 and spring of 1992, and by the end of March, 1992, all requirements had been fulfilled and a petition to grant a charter to Beta Upsilon Colony was approved by our Board of Directors.

The Department of Business and Economics at Baker University enrolls approximately 40% of all students on campus. The Department of Business and Economics consists of Accounting, Business Law, Economics, Finance, Management, Fashion Merchandising, and International Business. Founded three years before Kansas became a state, Baker University is a private, coeducational liberal arts institution operated by the United Methodist Church. It is the oldest four year university in Kansas. Total enrollment at the university approaches 900 full time students.

231st and Newest Chapter Installed at Saginaw Valley State University

On Saturday, May 30, 1992, the fraternity's 231st and newest collegiate chapter was installed as Mu Phi Chapter at Saginaw Valley State University. Mu Phi Chapter is the ninth chapter established in the state of Michigan, and is a part of the Huron Region in the Northern Province. In the fall of 1987, Regional Director Frederick C. Lipsey (now Northern Provincial Vice President), contacted then Director of Chapter Services C. Dean Ferguson at The Central Office to inform him of a group of

students at Saginaw Valley State University who were interested in forming a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi.

A letter of approval to start a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi on campus was received from Dean James L. Mitchell in November of 1987. After an informational meeting was held by then Regional Director Frederick C. Lipsey, the students sent a letter of intent to establish a chapter to The Central Office. C. Dean Ferguson visited the colony in March, 1988, and attended a colony and executive committee meeting. The colony originally consisted of 31 members.

Additional recruiting took place in the fall of 1988, and professional, community service, fund raising, and social activities were sponsored by the chapter. Then Chapter Consultant Steven R. Whalen visited the colony in early 1989, to assist with their recruiting efforts, and offered ideas and suggestions for professional events. With intensive recruiting efforts spearheaded by C. Dean Ferguson and The Central Office, the colony quickly gained 37 new collegiate members from the over 60 students who attended a special recruiting function.

The colony then continued its efforts to fulfill their chapter charter requirements, and in March of 1992, their petition for a chapter charter was approved by our Board of Directors. On the morning of May 30, 1992, a large group of Deltasigs gathered in Saginaw, Michigan for the installation of Mu Phi Chapter. Grand President William R. Kinsella served as Headmaster, and was joined by Northern Provincial Vice President Frederick C. Lipsey, Huron Regional Director Jeffery S. Fizer, Director of Administrative Services Robby L. Hultz, and District Director Huong-Hoa Tran. The installation team was joined by the members of Xi Chapter at the University of Michigan, Gamma Theta Chapter at Wayne State University and Delta Rho Chapter at Ferris State University. On this day 29 collegians joined the ranks of our Brotherhood.

Saginaw Valley State University was originally founded in 1963 as a private college. In 1965, the college became a state supported university and the newest of Michigan's fifteen state institutions of higher learning. The university serves more than 6,400 students, and offers over 80 majors to students at both the undergraduate and graduate level. Degree programs at the College of Business and Management are offered in Economics, Finance, Management, Industrial Management, Marketing, and General Business.


1992 Sidney A. Sparks Collegian of the Year

Contributions made to the Annual Campaign of the Leadership Fund from alumni and friends have made this program possible. Nineteen scholarships were awarded this year on the basis of fraternal involvement, campus and community service, and demonstrated scholastic achievement.

Your guide to understanding the Leadership Fund

What is the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Fund?

The Leadership Fund is a tax-exempt, public, charitable and educational corporation with an Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) standing.

What does the Leadership Fund do?

The Mission Statement of the Leadership Fund provides a great deal of insight as to the purpose of this organization:

"The Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Fund exists to provide for the furtherance of business education through the extension of financial assistance and the support of worthy educational, scientific and charitable programs."

Where is it located?

The Leadership Fund shares office space with the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi at The Central Office in Oxford, Ohio. Its full mailing address and phone is:

Who runs the Leadership Fund?

The Leadership Fund is run through the volunteer efforts of Brothers in Delta Sigma Pi who comprise the Board of Trustees for the corporation. They, giving freely of their time and knowledge, guide the Fund and its programs. Additionally, the Fund is served by Michael J. Mazur, Jr., who is Executive Director, and Daniel S. Doyle, who serves as the Director of Alumni Development and administers to its daily operation.

Why raise money through the Leadership Fund?

The Fund asks for contributions in order to make resources available primarily for scholarships, grants, and educational/ leadership programming in the Fraternity. 
