

ver 1,250 brothers and guests traveled from all over the country to gather in The Big Easy and share the ultimate Deltasig Experience - Grand Chapter Congress.

From inspirational speeches to the Friday night parade of more than 1,000 Deltasigs toward a Steamboat Natchez cruise, to the Grand President's Tailgate and Dance, those four days brought memories that will not soon be forgotten.

Brothers collected more than 100 lbs. of pop tabs, donated food, bottled water, toiletries, toys and \$300 for the New Orleans Ronald McDonald House. Nearly 60 brothers and guests teamed up with Save Our Cemeteries to remove trash, weeds and other vegetation from around tombs in New Orleans' historical cemeteries.

Grand Chapter Actions

Updated bylaws are available online at dsp.org/bylaws.

Bylaws Article XII, Section 17 was amended to remove Inactive Status procedure details, to allow the Board flexibility in adapting to the changing collegiate environment via policies.

Bylaws Article XII, Section 11 was amended to remove ambiguity regarding a prospective pledge being rejected three times.

A Resolution to assemble resources to conduct a comprehensive review of the member selection bylaws and any related policies was approved. Recommended actions will be presented to the 2019 Grand Chapter.

The Honorary Initiation Ritual was updated by inserting the preamble to the bylaws and added a series of principles the initiate must agree to (similar to the collegiate initiation).

Gold chapters will have completed requirements of the Bronze and Silver levels, increased chapter communications, events and CDL training, and submit a chapter planning and operations report.

Space City Houston Leads Hurricane Harvey Relief Efforts

Within days of its discovery, Hurricane Harvey developed into a Category 4 hurricane, making landfall east of Corpus Christi, Texas and moving through Houston and later Beaumont. Deltasigs from across the Gulf Western Region acted swiftly. As Harvey made landfall in Rockport, a number of brothers from San Antonio to Austin Alumni Chapters quickly offered their homes, couches, and extra bedrooms to Deltasigs and others evacuating north. Gulf Western RVP Musanna Al-Muntasir coordinated the safety of brothers and chapters as he was evacuating himself with his family.

Brothers from around Texas started helping in relief efforts and helping each other. Working with a local charity in Houston, The Friends of the Phoenix, Space City Houston helped with transporting meals to a shelter on the city's outskirts. The effort would later serve over 2,000 meals to first responders in the National Guard operating shelters for flood evacuees. After hearing of the flooded home of our 2001 Lifetime Achievement awardee Frank Busch, Sam Houston State, several including Rufis Estis, Louisiana Tech, his wife Brenda, Jeff Berlat and Gilbert Landras,

both Houston, pulled together to salvage and clean out the damage that was left behind.

While serving on the Leadership Foundation Board of Trustees, Brother Mallonee oversaw the merger of the Leadership Fund and the Educational Foundation. Numerous scholarships and grants were added and funded during his term as Foundation President. In 1994, the first summer Leadership Academy was sponsored in Oxford with Deltasigs and invited guests learning the fundamentals of good leadership.

In 1994, Brother Mallonee was recognized for his

exemplary service, support and leadership by earning the Lifetime Achievement Award. This top honor, however, did not halt his support and love of Delta Sigma Pi. He has recently served as a District Director to award-winning Gamma Psi Chapter at Arizona and has continued to serve on Foundation committees. He continues to support the Leadership Foundation and is involved with a number of endowments that help a wide variety of brothers world-wide.
