# **Chapter Management Program Recognition**

The Chapter Management Program (CMP) is divided into three achievement levels: Accredited Chapter, Chapter of Recognition and Chapter of Excellence. The CMP allows chapter members, national leaders and staff to evaluate chapter operations and activities. Chapters are required to submit items to the National Fraternity to achieve each level and are expected to reach the Accredited Chapter level, which includes the minimum standards for every collegiate chapter. If all requirements for Accredited Chapter are completed, the chapter may try to achieve the second level, Chapter of Recognition, and then the third level, Chapter of Excellence.

Congratulations to the 32 chapters that reached Chapter of Excellence, 59 chapters reaching Chapter of Recognition and 104 that earned the Accredited Chapter!

#### EXCELLENCE

A Chapter of Excellence is operationally sound with a wellrounded program focusing on larger scale events and national Fraternity promotion. To earn Chapter of Excellence, a chapter must achieve the Accredited Chapter tier, the Chapter of Recognition tier and complete the required and optional items for the third tier.



"I started the club because I wanted those at our campus to know more about archery, and I wanted to find out if any of the other students had a passion for the sport like I do." Part of Brother Egger's passion for archery comes from her family's involvement in the sport. By the age of 7, Eggers was firing her first set of arrows and three years later she entered her first competition. Over the years, Eggers relied on the instruction of all her family members, including her younger brother, Brett. She believes Brett has pushed her to be better and they still work together today as they achieve their goals. ▲



A Gift Agreement between the donor and the Leadership Foundation sets forth the purpose of the fund and how scholarships or grants will be distributed.



# Fraternity Board "Minutes in Seconds" from August 2011

Actions included:

- ▲ Will move forward with task groups studying and seeking to improve regionalization, insurance, colonies, nominations and "chapter reorganization" processes. Ritual Task Force closed with GCC actions.
- ▲ Approved policy language to ban alcohol from certain activities where Ritual is performed.
- Approved updates to the Strategic Plan.
- ▲ Approved changes to special projects budget, including specific funding for Patriot 2.0 membership database software and officer portal.
- ▲ Approved policy changes to limit Board member expense reimbursement to nationally recognized events and to prohibit Grand Officers from accepting payment for services from chapters while in office.
- ▲ Approved a policy allowing chapter debit cards and prohibit-ing chapter credit cards.
- ▲ Approved a policy allowing international alumni chapters if they purchase their own insurance.
- ▲ Clarified dues payments for new initiates at quarter schools.

- ▲ Announced national award winners.
- Placed Southern California on probation for one year.
- Clarified LEAD event planning policy toward more standardization nationally.
- ▲ Approved all eligible for Golden Council membership.
- ▲ Amended standard pledge program to move collegiate brother interviews from a local option to a national requirement and to eliminate alumni interviews entirely.
- Clarified policy-to become effective March 1, 2012-for any fraternal entity involved in fundraising via alcohol distribution. Such groups must acquire or purchase liability insurance coverage from the vendor or a third party insurer and provide the Central Office a copy of the certificate of insurance listing the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi as an additional insured at least 10 days prior to any such fundraiser. Note: While this goes into effect March 1, 2012, many of the provisions already exist.

# Love of the Game Into a CAREER By: Kellsey Miller

Ashleigh Anderson, *Florida State*, fell in love with golf at an early age. She was first introduced to the sport through the Orlando Minority Youth Golf Association, a program designed to introduce inner-city kids to the sport, many of whom would have not had the chance to learn to play otherwise. Golf became her passion and today she is making a career out of what she loves, while giving back to the golf community through her job with the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA).

"I love golf and I enjoy working with others who are just as passionate about their jobs—my colleagues and I are not motivated strictly to make a bottom line. We work to showcase the most talented women professional golfers in the world and grow the game of golf."

Although her official title is senior coordinator, tournaments and member programs, Brother Anderson jokes that she is a "jack of all trades" in her department. One role is to serve as the regional tournament coordinator and national tournament director for the LPGA's Teaching and Club Professional membership. Teaching and Club Professionals (T & CP) are women who are within the golf industry and directly influence the game as teaching professionals, coaches and golf professionals at clubs and facilities around the world. The LPGA certifies these women through a golf education curriculum, which is one of the leading and most sought after programs in the industry. The program educates members on how to teach the game; effectively manage golf facilities; and coach successful high school and college golf teams. Anderson is currently pursuing LPGA T & CP certification.

In addition, she is responsible for coordinating promotional programs including the LPGA Front Row Experience presented by Michelob Ultra and LPGA Tour Junior Golf Clinics held at several LPGA Tour events each year. Since her position requires a cross-section of functions, she learns something new every day. Anderson also finds time to work as a Junior Golf Instructor for the Orlando Minority Youth Golf Association and youth mentor for Tee-Lo Golf.

Very few people realize that golf is a \$76 billion industry, which is higher than the motion picture and recording industries combined. The industry not only includes the LPGA, PGA Tour, PGA of America, but golf clubs and resorts, retail and equipment companies, and more. The golf industry also donates more than \$3.5 billion annually to charities across the country, which is more than any other sport. Brother Anderson says the charitable aspect is part of what makes her proud to work in the industry.

"I love golf and I enjoy working with others who are just as passionate about their jobs–my colleagues and I are not motivated strictly to make a bottom line. We work to showcase the most talented women professional golfers in the world and grow the game of golf," said Anderson.

While there are too many experiences during her career with the LPGA to name a favorite, Anderson has had the chance to meet many influential people and big names in the golf industry, including Nancy Lopez—who was one of her golf heroes growing up.

industry is difficult and highly competitive; Brother Anderson notes that candidates who are passionate about sports and have some experience in the industry receive preference. She also says internships are key, especially for candidates with broader majors such as sports management. If you have trouble finding an internship, but played a sport in college—whether it be on your school's team or just an intramural—include it on your resume. Anderson played on the women's golf team at Florida State and interned for First Tee, a youth development program dedicated to providing young people the opportunity to develop through golf and character education. Also, consider volunteering for a sporting event or program. This shows potential employers that "you are not just a fan, but a committed candidate looking to create a career in the industry," said Anderson.
