

#### History if The University of Texas at Austin

The goal of The University of Texas is to enrich the public through technology, innovation, research, scholarship, teaching and service. With the numerous programs, degrees and services offered at the University, we are able to touch the lives of thousands every year.

Founded in 1883 on 40 acres of land near the state capital The University of Texas at Austin, the main UT campus, now encompasses more than 375 acres across the greater Austin area. Under The University of Texas System, the University eventually grew to its present 15 component institutions across the state. With its 15 component institutions across the state of Texas, the influence of The University of Texas System reaches well beyond the main campus at Austin. The 307 foot tall UT-Austin Tower, designed by Paul Cret of Philadelphia and completed in 1937, stands in the heard of campus as a symbol of the scholarship and spirit of UT-Austin.

UT-Austin has an annual enrollment of approximately 49,000 students in the various colleges and programs. Approximately 25 percent of which are enrolled in graduate and professional programs throughout the various colleges, giving UT-Austin the distinction of awarding the greatest number of doctorate degrees of any university in the nation. Home to students from every county in Texas, all 50 states and about 120 foreign countries, UT-Austin also offers a culturally diverse and inviting environment to any student. Then University of Texas at Austin is the largest university in the nation.

The University of Texas at Austin has 15 colleges and schools that offer over 200 programs through more than 6,000 courses each semester. Of the first-time freshmen students applied in 1999, 59.5% were admitted, of which 37.2% enrolled in the fall semester. Amongst those enrolled in 1999, 50% were in the top 10% of their high school graduating class, and 87% were in the top 25% of their graduating class. 

#### SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS

#### History

The University of Texas' School of Business Administration was founded in 1922 and has been awarding both Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Master of Business Administration (MBA) degrees. In 1930, the School was authorized to grant the Doctor of Philosophy Degree (Ph.D.) in business, and in 1948, the Master of Professional Accounting (MPA) degree was established. In 1955, the school instituted its first executive development programs, and now offers a full array of custom-designed, company-specific, and public programs. The Professional Program in Accounting (PPA) degree, where students earn both the BBA and the MPA in five years of study was added to the School's repertoire in 1985.

#### Enrollment

The Business College has enrolled 4,077 Undergraduate students, 1,250 Graduate students, and 126 Doctoral students. Of the Undergraduate students, there are 601 Freshmen, 823 Sophomores, 1051 Juniors, 1,602 Seniors.

Majors and degree plans include Accounting, Professional Program in Accounting, Business Honors Program, Engineering Route to Business, Finance, International Business, Management, Management Information Systems, and Marketing. Undergraduate student categorization by major is shown below:

#### Degree Offerings

#### Accounting

A BBA in Accounting prepares students for a wide variety of professional opportunities, including positions in public and corporate accounting for businesses and not-for-profit organizations. Coursework deals with:

- Collection, recording, summarizing and interpretation of financial data
- Uses of accounting data by management
- Uses of accounting procedures in all phases of financial matters
- Uses of computers and other electronic means of handling accounting data.

#### **Professional Program in Accounting**

The Professional Program in Accounting is a five-year program leading to both the BBA degree and the Master in Professional Accounting (MPA) degree. In this special honors-type program, students may choose a generalist "track" or one of the following areas of specialization:

- Auditing and Financial Reporting
- Taxation
- Information Management
- Management Accounting and Control

#### **Business Honors Program**

The Business Honors Program is both a major and a program. It provides an intellectual challenge for serious and accomplished students and preparation for immediate entry into a challenging business career or graduate studies. Honors students may design a general program of study or concentrate on one of the major programs in business. Students take ten core business courses in special sections designed to cover material comparable to first-year graduate courses.

Most Honors students choose another business field as a second major. This allows them to pursue any career path that a graduate from that major field could pursue. A wide range of job opportunities are available for the Business Honors Program graduate, with many in investment banking and strategic consulting.

#### **Engineering Route to Business**

The Engineering Route to the Bachelor of Business Administration provides a sound foundation in mathematics, science, and business, qualifying the student for more advanced study in the management of technological, engineering, and scientific enterprises. In addition to specific required business and engineering courses, the program contains two block options, designed to help students develop greater competence in particular aspects of engineering and business:

- A four-course engineering block option and
- A three-course business block option.

The combination of engineering and business prepares a graduate for sales and management positions in high-tech and engineering companies, with manufacturers, in banking, and as consultants.

#### Finance

In the market economy, a variety of financial institutions are instrumental in the orderly processes of production, distribution, and consumption. The Finance program offers students an opportunity to study the finance function in the business firm, the financial system, and the financial markets as well as the roles of commercial banks, investment and security firms, and other financial institutions.

Finance is a basic necessity for any business operation. Job duties generally fall in two categories:

- Evaluation of financial assets and
- Financial planning and analysis

Positions are located in the commercial banking industry, the securities industry, and in large corporations and small businesses.

#### **International Business**

The global economy has become a reality, and the International Business major has been developed for students who are actively seeking to focus their education on the global dimension of business. The International Business major has the objective of providing students with a solid basic business education, a knowledge of the international dimensions of business, specialization in one major world region and an associated language, and direct overseas experience. The educational experience is designed to prepare students for positions in business, government, and international agencies in the fields of industrial development, international trade, and global business operations and planning.

International Business graduates will often start their careers in the domestic operations of an organization. Overseas assignments usually come after a few years with a company, although they may come faster if the student possesses specialized skills (e.g., language) needed by the company in its foreign operations. Alternatively, many opportunities exist domestically to advance to positions of coordinating global activities.

#### Management

The major objective of the Management program is to train broadly competent administrators for service in a wide variety of organizations – public or private, product- or service-oriented, profit or not-for-profit. Students acquire knowledge about the management of human and physical resources and skills useful in the management of any organization. In addition, the degree program in Management introduces the student to the application of the acquired knowledge and skills to such areas as personnel/human resource management, industrial relations, production management, and small business.

#### **Management Information Systems**

The Management Information Systems major prepares a professional who can fully appreciate the complexity of information system design. The graduate has both the technical and the managerial knowledge to solve fundamental business problems in such areas as inventory control, production, forecasting, finance, or cost accounting.

Courses provide a foundation in the integration of hardware, software, and business functional analysis for business systems. The program in MIS trains students to develop information systems for organizational needs in all types of business.

#### Marketing

The field of Marketing includes a variety of related business activities. While individual occupations within these diverse areas may be specialized, decisions in any one of them require a broad understanding of the marketing process and an ability to analyze the factors that influence it. The marketing process begins with the identification and design of products or services which will satisfy customer needs profitably. It continues with the packaging, pricing, advertising, distribution, sales promotion, and servicing of the firms' offerings.

The major in Marketing is designed as a comprehensive study of all these activities, providing both the common background required for any marketing career and an opportunity for specialization based on the student's interests.

#### History of the Petitioning Group

The Beta Kappa chapter of Delta Sigma Pi was chartered at The University of Texas at Austin in 1930. For 60 years the Beta Kappa chapter operated successfully at The University of Texas at Austin. However, in the early 1990s the chapter closed its doors. In the spring of 1999, a group of highly motivated students created Beta Beta Beta in hopes of re-establishing Delta Sigma Pi to The University of Texas at Austin.

In a period of less than a year, the Beta Beta Beta Colony had established itself as a highly involved, motivated, enthusiastic colony with the ability to foster the study of business, to encourage scholarship, to increase community and university involvement, and to establish a sense of fellowship. Each member has dedicated their time to the success of the Beta Beta Beta Colony. Over the year, Beta Beta Beta has hosted, participated, and administered numerous events ranging from professional events, community service, social activities, and many more. This involvement has helped the colony develop into one of the most active organizations on campus. The Delta Sigma Pi name has returned to The University of Texas at Austin as a Fraternity of honor, prestige, and permanence and the Beta Beta Beta Beta Colony hopes to continue this existence for many years to come.
