Resume of the Chi Delta Mu Fraternity

From 1926 until 1928 the Chi Delta Mu Fraternity operated as a DeMolay Club, and in December 1928, the name of this Club was changed to Chi Delta Mu Fraternity. As a freaternity the numbers increased to such an extent that we were forced to establish a new residence whereby a larger number could be accommodated.

Since the organization of the fraternity, we have initiated approximately one hundred and twenty members. The average number initiated per year is approximately twenty-two members. The scholastic standing of this fraternity has been of an outstanding nature ever since it has been operating as a fraternity. In 1933 the fraternity failed by a one half point margin to carry out the scholarship award offered by the school for the first time to a fraternity or sorority group making the highest scholaric average. This prize will be offered annually in the future. Previous to this year we have had the highest average of all groups and clubs and fraternities and sororities in the years of 1930-1932. The average percentage of the entire fraternity at the present time is 88.09 per cent.

At last years graduation eight Chi Delt men graduated with honors.

We expect to repeat this feat in the coming year. One of the members had the honor of graduating with Summa Cum Laude, -- The highest honor awarded to any graduate of Rider College.

While the members of the fraternity have been outstanding in scholastic ability they have not neglected their social and athletic activity of the school. In 1930-1931 the basketball championship was won, in 1932-1933 the track championship of Rider College was won. In 1932 the baseball championship of Rider College was won. The members of the fraternity hold offices in the various athletic activities.

This includes, captaincy of varsity track team both indoor and outdoor in 1932-1933. Members of the fraternity hold varsity position on each of the major athletic teams of the College.

Our expansion has been very rapid and has continued to be on the increase ever since the beginning. At the present time we have members in all of the school activities. This includes the dramatic club, forum club, the presidency of the Interfraternity Council and the Concertmaster of the Rider Symphony Orchestra. Three members of the Chi Delta Mu

Fraternity belong to the Skull and Sabre Honor Society of Rider College.

The Financial condition of the Fraternity has always been excellent, and the future looks even more bright than the past.

At the present time there are sixteen members at the house, and eight members who are not. Our house will comfortably accommodate twenty eight members, but we can provide for thirty-three.

The fraternity does not own its own home, but the conditions surrounding the rental of the home are unusual in that the rental is unusually low, and at sometime in the future this property will be donated to the fraternity.

We present to you a copy of the constitution herewith for your perusal.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CHI DELTA MU FRATERNITY

We, the brothers of the Chi Delta Mu Fraternity, in order to form an everlasting association of friendships, establish social contacts, promote greater college activities and spirit, and secure the blessings of brotherly love to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the Chi Delta Mu Fraternity.

Article I

Sec.1

All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in the brothers of the Chi Delta Mu Fraternity.

Sec.2

The name of this organization shall be "Chi Delta Mu". The meetings of this fraternity shall be held on the first and third Tuesday nights of each month, or more often, as the President shall decide, or as hereinafter provided for.

Article II

Sec.I

Elective officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, corresponding secretary, house manager, historian and inter-fraternity counsel representative. All shall hold office for six months.

The persons nominated for office may vote for that respective office.

The semi-annual election of officers shall be held on the first stated meeting nights of December and June of each year.

The officers shall be installed at the next stated meeting of January and July.

ArticleIII

Sec.1

The president shall officiate and preside over the fraternity during its deliberations, and shall see that the Constitution and By-Laws are properly enforced, and the purpose of the fraternity is accomplished. He has the power to veto all motions made. A vote after this veto will consist of three-fourths of two-thirds of all members of the fraternity.

Special meetings may be called by the president at his discretion, the purpose of which shall be stated in call, and no other business shall be transacted.

Sec. 2--Article III

The duties of the vice-president shall be to assist the president in the discharge of his duties, and in the event of his absence to the right to preside over the meeting and assume all the responsibilities of the president's office.

Sec. 3

The secretary shall record the proceedings of the fraternity: receive all the money due the fraternity: keep a complete semi-annual report to the fraternity: keep a complete register of alltthe members of the fraternity: keep a correct account of the money received and expended and write letters to parents for their cooperation in with the treasury if pecessary.

The secretary issues invitations to all the house parties: is the chairman of all dances and has the power to send convalescent cards to all members of sororities and fraternities who may be indisposed.

Sec. 4

The treasurer shall receive all money for the house, keeping a just and regular account and paying on the same as becomes necessary: shall give a semi-annual report at the meeting immediately preceeding the elections: shall submit his account to an audit at a reasonable item before making the semi-annual report to the fraternity. He shall also submit a monthly report of the income and expenditures.

Sec. 5

The corresponding secretary shall issue all summons for special and regular meetings and perform such other duties as the president, secretary and treasurer may require.

Article IV. Sec. 1

The president, vice-president, secretaries and treasurer shall constitute an executive committee to pass on all items not covered by laws or precedent,

and a majority vote shall be final.

Article V. Sec. II.

Any white, fellow of good moral reputation and belonging to the business departments of Rider College who has reached the age of sixteen years shall be eligible for membership in Chi Delta Mu Fraternity.

Article VI. Sec. I;

The dues shall be one dollar per term payable at the beginning of the term.

All old members of the Demolay Club are to be charged ten dollars to join Chi Delta Mut Fraternity.

Sec. 2

Every member of the fraternity shall purchase his fraternity pin from the official jeweler through the secretary. This is not obligatory but is recommended for the member.

Sec. 3

Any member may withdraw from membership by giving a formal written notice and surrendering his shingle two months before his decision is made final, and shall not be reinbursed for his fraternity pin.

Each member is allowed to bring one guest to a fraternity dance except the Initiatory Formal. The assessment must be paid by the member before the dance.

No member is allowed to attend any social function of the fraternity if he has any outstanding bills in the fraternity.

Any officer who is absent from two regular meetings in succession may be dropped from office in favor of someone who makes a greater interest in the fraternity.

Sec. 4

All seniors members, should leave a picture at the house for the history book.

The president of the fraternity shall leave a framed picture for the fraternity house.

House fees of members living in the house are three dollars a year. Those members living outside of the house will pay five dollars a year.

Every member must excuse himself from the meetings by securing recognition from the president.

No member or pledgees of Chi Delta Mu are permitted to join or have membership in another fraternity, association, or c ub which will interfere with the best interests of Chi Delta Mu.

Addition to Article V. SEC. VI

The house manager and his assistantsshall enforce the house rules and perform such other duties as are necessary for the successful operation of the fraternity house.

Article VII. SEC. I

Every member isto be assessed twenty five cents for being absent from a meeting without a good excuse. This excuse is to be judged by the executive committee.

Article VIII. SEC. I

This Constitution may be amended atany stated meeting whentwo-thirds of the members present vote in the affirmative.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CHAPTER TREASURER

The Treasurer of each chapter of Delta Sigma Pi is required to prepare the necessary figures for the financial statements contained in this report, and file same with The Central Office within thirty (30) days after the close of each college semester or quarter, and at any other time as may be required by the Grand Secretary-Treasurer. Failure to file this report properly filled out within the prescribed time subjects the chapter to a fine of \$5 for each month's delay in filing.

First of all you should bring all your entries up to date, post them, then close your books, take off a trial balance and see that your accounts are in perfect balance. Reconcile your checking account and see that the balance as shown by your bank statement, after making allowance for checks outstanding, agrees with the balance as shown in Account Number 1. Then prepare the necessary Balance Sheet (Schedule I) and Statement of Income and Expenditures (Schedule II) as required by this report. Unless your TOTAL ASSETS agree with your TOTAL LIABILITIES your books are NOT in balance. The difference between your TOTAL INCOME and your TOTAL EXPENDITURES indicates your profit or loss for the period. There are plenty of extra lines for the listing by name and account number, all accounts you may have that are not specifically designated in the Standard Accounting System by name and number.

It is essentially important that the analysis of your Accounts Receivable (Schedule III) be filled out in detail, showing the amount owed to your chapter by each member. If, for instance, your report is being prepared as of January 31st, all January charges remaining unpaid on January 31st should be listed in Column 3 (less than 30 days old); all December charges remaining unpaid on January 31st should be listed in Column 2 (30-60 days old) and charges made in November or prior thereto, and still unpaid on January 31st, should be listed in Column 1. The total of all items listed in Columns 1, 2 and 3 should agree with the total amount listed in Column 4, which is simply a total of the other three columns. History of

RIDER COLLEGE

Rider College was organized in 1865 as the Rider Business
College and it operated under this plan until 1893 when it consolidated with Stewart College. In 1901 it combined with the
Moore Business School with the name of Rider-Moore-Stewart School.
In 1914, the name was changed to Rider College. The new charter
from the State of New Jersey in 1914 showed the purpose of the
school as follows:

- a. To maintain and operate a school or schools for the training of youths in academic, commercial, and technical branches of General Education.
- b. To establish and maintain a library or libraries and to furnish the same with books, reviews, magazines, newspapers and other publications which will enlarge the library facilities of Rider College. This is now being erected. It will include new laboratories for scientific study and research.

The College has an average enrollment of 1400 to 1600 students of which about 50% are co-eds. The portion of the male students furnish splendid fraternity material. There are six active fraternities on the campus who maintain houses. These fraternities have an average membership of twenty five men. There are also six sororities who maintain houses and who have a membership approximating that of the fraternities.

The location of the College is near the heart of Trenton, at the corner of State and Carrol streets, opposite the newly constructed post-office.

The departments of the College in which degrees are granted are:--

Accounting

Business Administration

Journalism

Secretarial Science

Education (School of Education)

Liberal Arts

In 1927, the state Board of Education granted permission to Rider College to grant degrees in Commerce. In 1930, the same board granted permission to also grant degrees in Education.

A new Library is being erected. This building will include laboratories for scientific study and research. The Carnegie library foundation has supported this project.

Rider has a bright future and will without question remain one of the leading educational institutions in the state of New Jersey.


