

As the Empire Regional Vice President, it would my honor to recommend the Colony at Rutgers University-Newark for installation this Spring. My first interaction with the colony was at the past Grand Chapter Congress, and they have grown tremendously over the past year under the guidance a local alumni and our new District Director, Charles Weening. They have proven their commitment to the Fraternity through their ability to tenaciously follow the policies and procedures and demonstrated active engagement as organizational members in the region.

The colony was initially challenged by their university's student life regulations and transformed the obstacle into an opportunity for preparation and growth. The university mandated a probationary period for all new student clubs for a full semester, which caused a delay in their recruitment and hindered their ability to host more events for their petition. Since they were only able to do sign-up tables during this time, they took the free time to be strategic and plan ahead for the upcoming academic year to ensure the colony did not lose their momentum.

Over the summer, I reviewed the national and regional strategic initiatives with our District Director to ensure the colony's strategic plans were aligned to the Fraternity. The colony hosted multiple information sessions in packed classrooms, and they also invited an alumni brother from the Alpha Gamma Chapter at Penn State to speak to potential recruits about her experience as a Deltasig. The colony provided the region and their university with lots of updates on their events via social media, and their online presence has been professional, well-mannered, and engaging. The colony's student peers along with the university staff and administration seem to be impressed with their substantial efforts to brand and distinguish themselves as a brotherhood amongst other professional organizations within the business school.

In terms of national involvement, the colony president attended Grand Chapter Congress in 2017, President's Academy in 2019, and Spring Provincial LEAD in 2019 and has brought along several other members to regional events in both 2017 and 2018. The colony takes initiative to understand and learn from other chapters in their province and is actively involved in interchapter relations such as our region's annual picnic and social media groups on Facebook, Instagram, and GroupMe. I trust that they will only continue to grow as they have built a strong foundation of 39 dedicated members to sustain their chapter for years to come. # **Rutgers University – Newark History**

Rutgers University-Newark is a culturally diverse and urban environment. These qualities contribute directly to the development and success of students in of higher education. RU-N's roots date back to 1908. New Jersey Law School opened to serve the community and formed an alliance with four educational institutions: Dana College, Newark Institute of Arts & Sciences, the Seth Boyden School of Business, and the Mercer Beasley School of Law. In 1946, the University became part of Rutgers University after the New Jersey State Legislature voted to enact a merger. Today there are over 12,000 students and 500 faculty, Rutgers University-Newark strives to teach at a world-class level. RU-N has been rated as the most diverse campus in the nation by several sources (notably *US News and World Report*, as well as *Forbes*). This title has been held since 1997. The campus serves many first-generation students and students who do not speak English as their first language.

Students and all members of the Rutgers University-Newark community are proud of the emphasis on the diversity. There is a powerful story that led to Rutgers University-Newark to achieve its status as the most diverse university in America. In February 1969, the Black Organization of Students listed a series of demands focused on including more minority students and professors in Rutgers. They took these demands to the administration. Their message was heard by through protest and taking over Conklin Hall on the Newark campus. Their efforts proved to be successful when the NJ Board of Education required the Rutgers administration to enroll more minorities. 50 years later, this has helped Rutgers University-Newark become the most diverse university in America for over 20 years.







# **Event Summaries**


### Community Engagement Day (Community)

- When: April 14, 2018
- Where: Farm at Hawkins Street Elementary School Newark, NJ
- Who: Approx. 200 attendees
- With: Volunteer Event to aid the staff of Hawkins Street Elementary.
- What: For Community Engagement Day, DSP leadership volunteered at a local elementary school in Newark. We aided staff in the agricultural work required to maintain and grow their on-site garden. This event was a great opportunity to work with other student organizations and be a part of the community farm that helps teach students in the area.

- Who: 20+ attendees
- What: Held the "Navigating the Workforce Post Graduation" Informational Session. This session helped students understand and prepare for aspects of corporate life they will be experiencing in their new environments. Christina Harding, a DSP alum, spoke on her experiences during her time as a student as well as her experiences as a DSP alum. It was an enlightening experience for members to hear what it was like to be a part of DSP and learn about DSPs alumni network.

#### Community Engagement Day II (Community)

- Who: 8 students
- With: Collaboration with numerous Rutgers-Newark organizations.
- What: Along with other organizations apart of the Rutgers-Newark community, we organized necessary supplies and items in respective packages to be given to the homeless in Newark. Furthermore, we checked if any food/beverage items were expired and disposed of them accordingly.

- What: Discussing the challenges being faced in the community of Newark and hearing from the people at the helm of these issues

- Where: Essex Hall Paul Robeson Campus Center, Rutgers Newark

- With: In partnership with the PIN initiative and students from NJIT, Seton Hall, Montclair State, Stevens, Rutgers Newark, and Rutgers New Brunswick
- What: Students hearing from community/business leaders about local economy, environment, and culture. Then an open discussion with speakers and experts about ways to potentially improve the city so they can break into teams and work on projects

The last hour of the event included a networking portion which gave students the ability to get to know the nature of the alumni's careers more in depth.

Professor Guarino focused on the threats these bubbles pose on the US economy, and the impact that could occur if the bubbles burst. Additionally, he spoke to students on how to avoid falling trap to these bubbles in their own lives.






