HISTORY OF OLEAN

1. WHEN AND UNDER WHAT CIRCUMSTANCES

- A. MAJOR ADAM HOOPS BOUGHT 20,000 ACRES OF LAND FROM THE HOLLAND LAND COMPANY IN APRIL 1804 FOR AN INVESTMENT. BENJAMIN VAN CAMPEN (BORN 1776) SURVEYED ALL THE LAND FOR HOOPS FROM 1802 - 1804. HOOPS JUST CAME TO OLEAN IN 1804. HE NEVER LIVED HERE. LIVED IN CANANDAIGUA AND PHILADELPHIA. MAJOR ROBERT HOOPS - BROTHER'S AGENT - WAS THE FIRST SETTLER, BUILT THE FIRST HOUSE HERE.
- B. NAME --- SUGGESTED BY OIL SPRING FROM LATIN OLEUM, MEANING OIL. HOOPS ASKED THEM TO CALL IT OLEAN POINT -BUT IT WAS COMMONLY CALLED HAMILTON FOR ALEXANDER HAMILTON, UNTIL 1823, WHEN THE FIRST MAP WAS MADE CALLING IT OLEAN.



THE HISTORY OF SAINT BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY


SAINT BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY BEGAN AS A VISION IN THE MIND OF NICHOLAS DEVEREUX, A PIONEER LANDOWNER IN THE ALLEGANY VALLEY SECTION OF WESTERN NEW YORK STATE. HIS WAS A TWO-FOLD DREAM: TO SUPPLY THE MUCH NEEDED PRIESTS IN THE AREA, AND ALSO TO FOUND THE UNIVERSITY WHICH HE DESIRED TO BE BUILT AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF A EUROPEAN-FASHIONED UNIVERSITY CITY.

MR. Devereux traveled to Rome and placed his request for aid before His Holiness Pope Pius IX, who directed him to the superior of the Franciscan Order. His dream was soon realized when a band of four pioneers led by the first superior, Father Pamphilus da Magliano, left for the wilderness of Western New York.

At the time Mr. Devereux made his request he promised 200 acres of Land and \$5000 for the foundation of a monastery on the site of the Land at Allegany, New York. On August 23, 1854, Bishop Timon of Buffalo Laid the cornerstone of Saint Bonaventure College. In 1858, upon its completion the friars and brothers now numbering to fourteen, moved to Allegany from their temporary home in Ellicottville, New York. The new college was dedicated to St. Bonaventure, the patron of Franciscan Schools, and Father Pamphilus da Magliano, O.S.F., was elected its first president. The following year (1859) it opened its doors for the first time with a registration of fifteen students.

The term from 1859 to 1875 were years of expansion. In four eventful years the student registration had risen to sixty and a new monastery had been erected on the campus. In 1864, the first graduation exercise of St. Bonaventure College was held on the campus grounds. Ten years later a new building was erected, augmenting the available college

FACILITIES. THAT SAME YEAR THE COLLEGE BOASTED OF ANOTHER IMPROVEMENT; THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A LIBRARY. THE NEXT YEAR, 1875, FOUND FATHER CHARLES VISSANI DA MAZZONO, O.S.F. AS PRESIDENT; THE STUDENT BODY NUMBERING 133 AND THE FACULTY 13. ALSO THAT SAME YEAR THE REGENTS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK GRANTED THE COLLEGE A PROVISIONAL CHARTER WHICH WAS MADE PERMANENT UNDER THE PRESIDENCY OF FATHER THEOPHILUS POSPOSILK, O.S.F., IN 1883.

Four years later began the twenty-four year term of Father Joseph Butler, O.F.M. (1887-1911). These were the years of great expansion. It was during Fr. Butler's administration that the present Alumni Hall was built in 1887; the monastery was enlarged; a new classroom building, Lynch Hall, was constructed in 1900. Father Joseph, eight years later (1908), saw the new Lynch Hall gutted by flames. He zealously directed his activities towards its revonation and successfully completed this task before his death in 1911.

Next in line and carrying on after Father Joseph was St. Bonaventure's ninth president, Father Fidelis Reynolds, O.F.M. Father Fidelis standardized the Arts and Science courses. He added an accredited commercial and banking course and a pre-medical course. Due to the energies he devoted to the scholastic advancement of St. Bonaventure College, the rise of the Franciscan School was swift and constant.

IN 1916 FATHER ALEXANDER HICKEY, O.F.M. SUCCEEDED FATHER FIDELIS AS THE TENTH PRESIDENT OF ST. BONAVENTURE COLLEGE. FR. HICKEY WAS A GREAT POET, BUT BECAUSE OF HIS GREAT HUMILITY OF PERSON MANY OF HIS WORKS WERE NEVER PUBLISHED. THE FIRST YEARS OF HIS REIGN THE PRESENT GYMNASIUM WAS ERECTED AND NAMED IN HONOR OF FATHER JOSEPH BUTLER, O.F.M., THE FORMER PRESIDENT. DURING FR. HICKEY'S TERM THE STUDENTS ARMY TRAINING CORPS WAS ESTABLISHED.

TO COMBINE WITHIN HIS FRAME THE BEST QUALITIES OF HIS PREDECESSORS. ENDOWED WITH CONSERVTISM AND SOUND PROGRESSIVENESS HE GAVE A NEW IMPETUS TO THE EXPANSION AND PROGRESS OF ST. BONAVENTURE COLLEGE. DURING FR. TOM'S REIGN TWO DISASTEROUS FIRES SWEPT THE CAMPUS. THE FIRST WHEN THE BARNS BURNED DOWN TO THE GROUND, AND LATER A BOLT OF LIGHTNING STRUCK THE CLOCK TOWER OF LYNCH HALL. SERIOUSLY DAMAGING THE STRUCTURE. LYNCH HALL WAS COMPLETELY REMODELED AND IN 1934 DOVERNOR HERBERT H. LEHMAN DEDICATED THE RENOVATED STRUCTURE GIVING IT THE NAME DE LA ROCHE HALL. IN THE YEAR 1937. FRIEDSAM MEMORIAL LIBRARY WAS PRESENTED TO THE COLLEGE. THE LIBRARY, ONE OF THE MOST BEAUTIFUL IN WESTERN NEW YORK, CONTAINS OVER 120,000 SELECT VOLUMES AND A FILE OF OVER 2000 PERIODICALS. ALSO UNDER FATHER THOMAS THE FRANCISCAN INSTITUTE WAS FOUNDED IN 1934. IT IS A DISTINCT UNIT WITHIN THE DIVISION OF GRADUATE STUDIES. WITHIN ITS SCOPE ARE PHILOSOPHICAL, THEOLOGICAL AND HISTORICAL COURSES WITH EMPHASIS IN THE FRANCISCAN SCHOOL OF PHILOSOPHICAL STUDIES. AT THE PRESENT TIME TWENTY-SEVEN STUDENTS ARE ENGAGED IN STUDIES IN THIS INSTITUTION.

WITH THE CLOSE OF WORLD WAR II A NEW ERA BEGAN IN THE HISTORY OF ST. BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY. SERVICE-MEN AND WOMEN AVAILED THEMSELVES OF THE OPPORTUNITY OF THE G.I. BILL OF RIGHTS AND ENROLLED AT ST. BONAVENTURE COLLEGE. AND SO WE FIND THE INSTITUTION "LITERALLY BULGING AT THE SEAMS" WITH STUDENTS WHO AT PRESENT TIME NUMBER APPROXIMATELY FIFTEEN HUNDRED. TEMPORARY CLASSROOMS AND DORMITORIES WERE CONSTRUCTED IN ORDER TO TAKE CARE OF THE FLOOD OF STUDENTS. AT THE TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE GREAT FIRE WE FIND ST. BONAVENTURE ABOUT TO EMBARK UPON A PROJECT; THAT OF RAISING ALMOST NINE MILLION DOLLARS FOR A BUILDING PROGRAM. THE IMMEDIATE OBJECT OF THE PROGRAM IS TO CONSTRUCT A SCIENCE BUILDING, A STUDENT CENTER, TO COMPLETE THE SEMINARY OF CHRIST THE KING AND NEW GROUND LAYOUT. TO FOLLOW THIS PROGRAM ARE: ANOTHER FIREPROOF

DORMITORY, A FACULTY HOUSE, CHAPEL AND AN ADMINISTRATION AND BUSINESS School Building.

The year 1949 will be ever memorable for it marked the close of thirty-nine years of distinguished service at St. Bonas on the part of Father Thomas. Elevated to the office of Provincial of the Holy Name Province in July, 1949, he completed a full twenty years as president of the college. Father Juvenal Lalor, O.F.M. was formally installed on September 22, 1949, at a colorful ceremony unique in the annals of the Institution.

ON OCTOBER 4, 1950 ST. BONAVENTURE OFFICIALLY RECEIVED ITS NEW UNIVERSITY CHARTER. ON THAT GREAT DAY EVENTS REACHED A CLIMAX WHEN A FEW MINUTES BEFORE THREE O'CLOCK, DR. JACOB L. HOLZMANN, REGENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, SOLEMNLY PRESENTED THE NEW CHARTER TO THE (VERY) REV. FR. JUVENAL LALOR, O.F.M. IT WAS THEN THAT ST. BONAVENTURE JOINED THE RANKS OF UNIVERSITIES, AS THE FIRST UNIVERSITY IN THE HISTORY OF THE FRANCISCAN ORDER.

Thus we come to a close -- not of the history but of another glorious chapter in the annals of St. Bonaventure University. From its humble Franciscan beginnings it has finally grown to "man's estate" and ready to give added service in return for the confidence that has been placed in its educational policies. May the Spirit of St. Francis, which motivated the founding fathers, continue to permeate the academic atmosphere of this unique Franciscan University. May the students take this St. Bonaventure spirit with them in all walks of life, and thus fulfill in an even more glorious fashion the dreams of Nicholas Devereux of Utica and Bishop John Timon C. THOUGH MODERN NEEDS AND TRENDS IN EDUCATION HAVE ENLARGED THE SCOPE OF THE LIBERAL ARTS COLLEGE, ITS ACADEMIC STRUCTURE STILL RESTS, AND WILL CONTINUE, ON THE "SEVEN PILLARS OF WISDOM" OF ANCIENT AND MEDIEVAL DAYS.

THE EARLY DIVISIONS INTO ELEMENTARY AND THE HIGHER HAS GIVEN WAY INTO LARGER AREAS OF RELATED DEPARTMENTS. THE FUNCTION OF SUCH A DIVISION IS TO CLARIFY, SIMPLIFY AND UNIFY THE SPECIALIZED KNOWLEDGE ACQUIRED IN A GIVEN GROUP OF DEPARTMENTS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF BROADENING THE STUDENT'S OUTLOOK AND PROMOTING COOPERATION AMONG TEACHERS.

VIEWING "MAN" AS THE MAIN FOCUS OF ALL LIBERAL, HUMANISTIC AND CULTURAL STUDIES, ST. BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY, HAS SEEN FIT TO SELECT THE FOLLOWING DIVISIONS: "MAN AND HIS MIND" (PHILOSOPHY AND RELATED SCIENCES); "MAN AND HUMAN EXPRESSION" (ARTS AND LETTERS); "MAN AND NATURE" (NATURAL SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS). UNDER PROPER DIRECTION THE SCHOOLS DIVISIONS AND DEPARTMENTS SHOULD TEND TOWARDS IMPARTING A LIBERAL EDUCATION WHICH IS BROAD AND EXACT.

TO ACCOMPLISH THESE AIMS ST. BONAVENTURE HAS ESTABLISHED THE FOLLOWING SEVEN SEPARATE SCHOOLS:

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS OF SAINT BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY ARE SET BY THE BOARD OF ADMISSIONS. ADMISSIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY MAY BE GAINED BY SATISFACTORILY COMPLETING A FOUR YEAR COURSE IN AN ACCREDITED SCHOOL OR BY A SERIES OF ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS. WHEN CONSIDERED NECESSARY A COMBINATION OF BOTH METHODS MAY BE USED IN ADMITTING AN APPLICANT.

NORMALLY A STUDENT MUST PRESENT SIXTEEN UNITS FOR ENTRANCE. OF THE SIXTEEN UNITS REQUIRED FOUR MUST REPRESENT A SEQUENCE IN ENGLISH; THREE A SEQUENCE IN SOME ACADEMIC SUBJECT; AND TWO A SEQUENCE IN ANOTHER ACADEMIC SUBJECT. THE REMAINING SEVEN UNITS MAY OR MAY NOT BE ACADEMIC. APPICANTS WHO DO NOT QUALIFY FOR ADMISSION IN THIS MANNER MAY BE ADMITTED UPON THE COMPLETION OF ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS. THE NATURE OF THESE EXAMINATIONS WILL BE DETERMINED AFTER A CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OF THE APPLICANTS PREVIOUS TRAINING.

CAMPUS AND BUILDINGS

THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS IS ONE OF THE BEAUTY SPOTS OF WESTERN New York consisting of five hundred acres of Land, much of which has BEEN STOCKED WITH EVERGREENS AND FLOWERS.

AT THE PRESENT TIME THE ST. BONAVENTURE CAMPUS IS COMPOSED OF THE FOLLOWING BUILDINGS:

DEVEREUX HALL NAMED IN HONOR OF THE GREAT BENEFACTOR OF THE University, Mr. Nicholas Devereux, whose generosity enabled the Franciscans to establish St. Bonaventure in 1859. In provides accomodations for approximate five hundred students.

DE LA ROCHE HALL SO NAMED IN MEMORY OF THE PIONEER SON OF ST. FRANCIS WHO IS CREDITED AS BEING THE FIRST TO DISCOVER OIL IN THIS TERRITORY. THIS STRUCTURE IS DEVOTED TO CLASSROOMS.

ALUMNI HALL CONTAINING CLASSROOMS, OFFICES, MUSIC ROOMS AND AN AUDITORIUM. FR. ALEXANDER HICKEY MEMORIAL ERECTED THROUGH DONATIONS OF ALUMNI AND FRIENDS. IT IS AN EXCELLENTLY EQUIPPED DINING HALL.

ADMINISTRATION BUILDING A TEMPORY STRUCTURE HOUSING ALL UNIVERSITY OFFICES, BOOKSTORE AND POSTOFFICE.

CHRIST THE KING SEMINARY NOW NEARING COMPLETION. IT IS A THREE MILLION DOLLAR STRUCTURE STYLED IN THE ITALIAN TRANSITIONAL ARCHITECTURE. WHEN COMPLETED IT WILL CONTAIN DORMITORY, CHAPEL, GYMNASIUM. CLASSROOMS AND DINING HALL.

PLANS ARE NOW UNDER WAY FOR THE NEW STUDENT UNION BUILDING WHICH WILL HOUSE A GYMNASIUM, SEATING 5,000, AND NUMEROUS RECREATION ROOMS. THIS WILL BE ONE OF THE FIRST BUILDINGS TO COME UNDER THE NEW NINE MILLION DOLLAR BUILDING FUND RECENTLY INAUGERATED. UNDER THE BUILDING FUND OTHER BUILDINGS PLANNED WILL BE AS FOLLOWS: A SCIENCE BUILDING, A FIREPROOF DORMITORY, A FACULTY HOUSE, CHAPEL AND AN ADMINISTRATION AND BUSINESS SCHOOL BUILDING. UNTIL THIS BUILDING CAMPAIGN IS COMPLETED THE UNIVERSITY HAS ERECTED TWO TEMPORARY CLASSROOM BUILDINGS AND SIX TEMPORARY DORMITORIES.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of the school is to impart the principles of modern business and at the same time to emphasize the practical application of

THESE PRINCIPLES TO THE VARIOUS BRANCHES OF INDUSTRY, COMMERCE AND FINANCE.

A REAL INTERPRETATION OF CATHOLIC SOCIAL PHILOSOPHY, AND A GENUINE SENSE OF ETHICAL CONSIDERATION ARE FUNDAMENTAL IN ALL STUDIES. THE COURSES PREPARE THE STUDENT FOR A GERTAIN DEGREE OF SPECIALIZATION AND AT THE SAME TIME REQUIRES A BROAD APPRECIATION OF THE GENERAL FIELD OF BUSINESS. A SELECTION OF COURSES WILL PREPARE THE STUDENT FOR MANY PHASES OF THE BUSINESS WORLD, AS WELL AS THE CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNT (C.P.A.) EXAMINATIONS REQUIRED BY THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND FULFILL THE REQUIREMENTS OBLIGATORY AFTER JANUARY 1, 1938. THE COURSE FULFILL THE REQUIREMENTS FOR MOST OF THE STATES WHERE STATE-BOARD EXAMINATIONS ARE REQUIRED.

The courses are of four year's duration and lead to the degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.). The work consists largely of required courses to provide the cultural background for the student. Besides the grade required in order to obtain credit for any of the courses, the student must demonstrate his ability to operate a typewriter by some recognized "touch-system", and aptitude in operating business machines.

AT THE END OF THE FIRST SEMESTER OF THE SENIOR YEAR, ALL STUDENTS ASPIRING TO THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION MUST PASS A COMPREHENSIVE EXAMINATION IN ALL SUBJECTS OFFERED BY THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION.

PARTICULAR ATTENTION IS GIVEN THROUGHOUT THE COURSE TO SUCH CULTURAL SUBJECTS AS ENGLISH, LANGUAGE, HISTORY, AND PHILOSOPHY.

IT IS HOPED THAT A THOROUGH STUDY OF THE COURSES WILL PROVIDE THE STUDENT WITH A KEENER GRASP OF ALL THAT MAKES FOR SUCCESS IN THE WORLD BUSINESS ACTIVITY, SO THAT AT THE END OF A FEW YEARS OF BUSINESS EXPERIENCE HE WILL BE FURTHER ADVANCED, AND HAVE A MORE COMPREHENSIVE OUTLOOK OVER THE WHOLE FIELD OF BUSINESS THAN HE WOULD HAVE HAD WITH A LIFETIME OF MERE APPRENTICESHIP.

THE BUSINESS DEPARTMENT WAS ORGANIZED IN 1933. THE PROVISIONAL CHARTER WAS GRANTED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF NEW YORK STATE ON JANUARY 1, 1937. IT WAS FINALLY APPROVED ON JUNE 1, 1939. As a School of Business Administration it was set-up in 1949.

THE APPROXIMATE MEMBERSHIP OF THE STUDENTS IN THE BUSINESS SCHOOL OF ST. BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY NOW ENROLLED AS OF THIS DATE, IN NUMBER 410.

SINCE ITS INCEPTION, THE SCHOOL HAS EXPANDED ITS MAJOR OFFERINGS FROM TWO - IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND ACCOUNTING - TO FOUR. THE ORIGINAL TWO PLUS FINANCE AND BUSINESS EDUCATION ARE NOW OFFERED.

"Subsequent to January 1, 1938, every candidate for examination as a Certified Public Accountant shall present evidence that he has satisfactorily completed the course of study in college of school of accountancy registered by the State Education Department (The University of the State of New York) as maintaining a satisfactory standard, and that prior to the beginning of his course of study in such college or school of accountancy, he satisfactorily completed a four-year high school course approved for this purpose or the equivalent as determined by the Commissioner of Education" D 1948-a, Educational Law.

THE CHARTER AND BY-LAWS OF THE BETA BETA CHI PROVIDE THAT ANY STUDENT OF THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION, WHO IS OF GOOD CHARACTER AND IS MAINTAINING A C AVERAGE, IS ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP. IF A STUDENT WHO WISHES TO BECOME A MEMBER MEETS THESE REQUIREMENTS, HIS NAME IS READ AT TWO CONSECUTIVE MEETINGS AND AFTER THE SECOND READING A VOTE IS TAKEN. IF THE CANDIDATE RECEIVED TWO THIRDS OF A QUORUM, HE IS ACCEPTED. A BANQUET IS GIVEN EACH SEMESTER IN HONOR OF THE NEW MEMBERS.

IN ADDITION TO THE BANQUET THE FRATERNITY SPONSORS AN ANNUAL COCKTAIL PARTY, WHICH IS HELD THE WEEKEND OF THE JUNIOR PROM. ALSO AN ANNUAL ACTIVITY IS THE BBX RAFFLE, WHICH EXCLUDING MEMBERSHIP DUES, HAS BEEN OUR MAIN SOURCE OF INCOME. ALSO WHENEVER POSSIBLE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, LECTURES ARE GIVEN BY PROMINENT BUSINESS MEN ON VARIOUS PROBLEMS OF INTEREST TO THE STUDENT. THESE LECTURES BRING THE STUDENT INTO PERSONAL CONTACT WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES OF BUSINESS AND ALSO ENABLE THEM TO BECOME FAMILIAR WITH PRACTICAL BUSINESS PROBLEMS.

Besides these functions the BBX has undertaken to establish a trust fund, of \$1500. The interest on this fund provide for an award each year to be presented to the outstanding Business graduate, selected because of his achievement in studies and college activities. This award is called, "The Kinsella Award", in honor of Robert J. Kinsella, a deceased member of the Beta Beta Chi. THE BBX WITH ITS ORIGINAL TEN MEMBERS GREW QUICKLY UNTIL IT REACHED THE TOTAL OF FIFTY MEMBERS IN 1936. THE FRATERNITY RETAINED THIS NUMBER AS ITS AVERAGE MEMBERSHIP UNTIL IT WAS INACTIVATED BECAUSE OF WORLD WAR II. IN THE FALL OF 1945, BBX WAS REACTIVATED AND HAS GROWN AND PROGRESSED RAPIDLY UNTIL NOW WHEN IT HAS 66 MEMBERS AND IS DRAWING UP THIS PETITION FOR MEMBERSHIP INTO THE DELTA SIGMA PI.
