### History of Savannah State University

By act of the Georgia State General Assembly on November 26, 1890, the state of Georgia established in connection with the State University, and forming one of the departments thereof, a school for the education and training of Negro Students. A commission was appointed to procure the necessary grounds and buildings, and to prescribe a course of study that would include those studies required by the Morrill Land-Grant Acts of 1862 and 1890.

The commission on the school for Negro Students was designated as the Board of Trustees for the school, with perpetual succession subject to the general Board of Trustees of the University of Georgia. The Chancellor to the University of Georgia was given general supervision of the school.

A preliminary session of the school was held between June 1 and August 1, 1891, at the Baxter Street School Building in Athens, Georgia. Richard r. Wright, the first principal, and three other instructors comprised the faculty. In the following year the school was moved to its current site, which is approximately five miles southwest of the Courthouse of Savannah, Georgia, , partially in Savannah and Partially in Thunderbolt. The school was given the name "The Georgia State Industrial College for Colored Youths," and its faculty consisted of Major Wright as President, instructor in English, Mathematics, and Natural Sciences, a superintendent of the mechanical department, and a Forman of the farm.

During the thirty years that Major Wright served as President of the College, enrollment increased from 8 to 585 and the curriculum was expanded to include a normal division in addition to four years of high school. Training in agriculture and mechanical arts also began during this period.

The first women students were admitted as boarders in 1921; the first summer session was conducted in 1922; and in 1925 the governing body of the college was changed from a commission with a perpetual succession to a Board of Trustees whose members were appointed for four year terms. All of these changes occurred during the presidency of C.G. Wiley, the first alumnus of the college to become president, who served 1921 to 1926.





## History Continued...

Under President Benjamin F. Hubert (1927-1947), the entire academic program was reorganized. The high school and normal departments were discontinued and the school became a four-year college. In 1931, when the university system was placed under a Board of Regents, the college began to offer bachelor's degree programs with majors in English, the Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, and Business Administration, as well as in Agriculture and Home Economics.

Until 1947, the college served as the state land-grant institution for Negros. In that year this function was assumed by then Fort Valley State College.

During the administration of President James A. Colston (1947-1949), the faculty was strengthened and improvements were made in the physical plant. Among the programs that were launched at this time were the Alumni Scholarship Drive, Campus Chest, Annual Men's Day, Religious Emphasis Week, Freshman Week, and Cultural Artists Series. Expanded programs of student personnel services, and public relations, a reading clinic, and an audio visual aids laboratory were instituted under the leadership of President Colston.

Dean W.K. Payne Became acting president of the College on September 1, 1949. The Regents of the University System of Georgia changed the name from Georgia State College to Savannah State College on January 18, 1950; he served in this capacity until his death on July 26, 1963.

Timothy G. Myers served as acting president from the time of Dr. Payne's death until November 1, 1963. Myers had served as dean of the faculty since September 1953.

Under the leadership of Dr. Howard Jordan, Jr. (November 1, 1963- January 31, 1971), significant, far-reaching, innovative programs were initiated in all aspects of the College's development. Curricula improvements in the general education program in teacher education, and in business administration, as well as other areas, were carried forward. A graduate studies program in elementary education was initiated in the summer of 1968. The mantle of educational leadership was at Savannah State College passed from Dr. Jordan to Dr. Prince A. Jackson, Jr., on February, 1 1971.





### History Continued...

Many of the improvements and innovations begun during President Jordan's administration came to fruition during the first year of Dr. Jackson's tenure. The three engineering technology programs – civil, electronics, and mechanical – were accredited by the Engineers' Council for Professional Development in 1973. Dr. Jackson served until March 27, 1978, when he was succeeded by Dr. Clyde W. Hall, who at the time of his appointment as acting president was serving as Chairman of the Division of Technical Sciences.

In September 1979, due to the desegregation plan mandated by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, the faculty and students in the Division of Education at Savannah State College were transferred to Armstrong Atlantic State College and Savannah State College received the faculty and students in the division of Business from Armstrong Atlantic State College in a historic program swap resulted in the creation of a new School of Business at Savannah State College during the 1979-1980 academic year.

Additionally, on April 13, 1980 the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia approved a new Administrative organization plan for Savannah State was reorganized into three schools—Business; Humanities; Social Sciences; and Sciences & Technology. On September 15, 1980, Dr. Wendell G. Rayburn became the eighth president of Savannah State College.

In more recent years, Savannah State has increased enrollment, received more accreditation and received full university status in 1996. The university has expanded to offer over 23 majors to include Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Global Logistics and International Business, and Marine Biology.

# Savannah State University College of Business Administration (COBA)

Savannah State University is a highly prestigious university. With the business department having the same accreditation as the illustrious Harvard University, we are constantly looking to soar to new heights by seeking and conquering new endeavors. The College of Business Administration strives to build our brand by producing quality business students.

The School of Business was formed during the 1979-1980 academic year with the transfer of the Department of Business from Armstrong State College to Savannah State College and its merger with the Division of Business of Savannah State College. The main objective of the School of Business was, and still is today, to provide for its students a quality educational foundation that will allow them to be able to compete for employment in the rigorous business world. In accordance with students maximizing their educational profits and interests, the School of Business prepares students for positions of leadership and responsibility in the business environment.

In 1981, the School of Business offered majors in Accounting, Business Administration (general business major), Economics, Finance, Information Systems, and Office Administration. A joint program between Savannah State College and Armstrong State College was also authorized by the Board of Regents for a Master's degree in Business Administration (M.B.A.).

Currently, Savannah State University's College of Business Administration has grown profoundly. The motto for COBA is "Developing the Future Business Leaders in Coastal Georgia." The College of Business Administration offers a four-year professional program that syndicates a general education with broad based programs of education in the field of business with real-life scenarios incorporated throughout the course objectives. These programs are based on the philosophy that the best education for business leaders is one which combines professional studies and studies in the liberal arts.

The emphasis on the liberal arts is most significant during the freshman and sophomore years of business professional students. The major focus during the remaining years

of study is on the basic business core, which serves as the foundation upon which students develop a major. This education provides graduates with the essential background for initiating careers in one of the areas of business and an applicable introduction to the tools of management that are obligatory for success.

The College of Business Administration offers programs of study leading to the Bachelor of Business Administration degree (B.B.A) and the Master's Degree in Business Administration (M.B.A.). Major undergraduate programs include Accounting, Computer Information Systems (previously Information Systems), Management, and Marketing. The College of Business Administration also offers a Minor in Business (15 hours).





## Colony Development

During the summer of 2011 Members DeMontrez Johnson and Thomas Boucher began to discuss the possibility of reactivating a Delta Sigma Pi Chapter at Savannah State University. Tempest Jolley soon became a part of the group. They began to create a plan and started their research if Delta Sigma Pi. By the end of that summer they had identified an advisor and connected with several Alumni in the surrounding area.

The colony then began to form the Executive board which consisted of members with no official office. These members included David Prejean, Reginald Walker, Chelsea Young, Jessica Alford, Stephen Bailey and Maycio Vining. Together they conducted a membership informational by carrying colorful shoe boxes to class with strips of information inside to intrigue the interest of others. Also in that Fall Semester the group submitted a letter of intent to receive colony status, and it was granted that very same semester. The colony began to grow and an interest meeting was conducted. The colony also conducted events such as a beach cleanup, Ties and Treats, networking events, and many others.

In the spring of 2012 the colony received a visit from Dale Clark, Director of Chapter & Expansion Services, before the Southern L.E.A.D. conference. He was very impressed to see the developments made by the colony. The colony has grown and is ready to begin to function as a chapter. The colony members firmly believe that they have set a foundation worthy of chapter status.

#### Tamara Friedrich



Dr. Tamara Friedrich is an Assistant Professor of Management at Savannah State University where she teaches courses on leadership, organizational behavior, creativity and entrepreneurship, and general management. She received her PhD in Industrial and Organizational Psychology from the University of Oklahoma in 2010 and has been a faculty member at Savannah State since then. Her primary research interests fall into the broad categories of innovation and leadership, however much of her recent research falls into the intersection of these two areas. She has also conducted research on leadership in a collective context and how leadership is influenced by the social environment around them. Her work has appeared in several books and journals, including *The Leadership Quarterly, Creativity Research Journal*, and *Human Resource Management Review*. Finally, Dr. Friedrich is the Co-Founder and Director of the Center for the Advancement of Creativity and Entrepreneurship (The ACE Center) at Savannah State which focuses on developing student entrepreneurs, sponsoring faculty and student research, planning events to promote creativity and entrepreneurship, and developing a curriculum that supports these efforts.





#### Zelda James


