



U.O.P. History

UNIVERSITY HISTORY

The University of the Pacific was established by pioneer Methodist ministers in 1851 as the first chartered institution of higher learning in California. Originally founded in Santa Clara, the institution later moved to San Jose and in 1924 to its present location in Stockton.

Throughout its history, Pacific has been recognized as a leader in educational innovation. It provided the West Coast with its first medical school in 1858 (it later became part of Stanford and today is Pacific Medical Center), its first co-educational campus in 1871, its first conservatory of music in 1878, its first "cluster colleges", and its first and only four-year private institution in the Central Valley.

Pacific was also first in the nation to offer an undergraduate teacher corps program, the first to send an entire class to an overseas campus, and the first to establish a Spanish speaking Inter-American College.

Since the move to Stockton in 1924, only three presidents have headed the administration of the University. Tully C. Knoles presided thru the move from San Jose and served until he was succeeded by Dr. Robert E. Burns in 1946. Dr. Burns served as president until his death in 1971, and he was followed by our current president, Dr. Stanley E. McCaffrey.

The School of Education, offering upper division and graduate work, was established shortly after the move to Stockton in 1924. The University experienced its greatest growth and a broadening of its base under the administration of Dr. Burns. In 1955 it opened its School of Pharmacy and in 1956 its Graduate School. The School of Engineering was established in 1957. In 1962 the College of Physicians and Surgeons, a school of denistry founded in San Francisco in 1869, merged with the University of the Pacific.

The same year, a new concept in higher education in the United States found expression in the establishment of the first "cluster" college, Raymand College. This was followed in 1963 with the opening of the second such college, Elbert Covell College, the first bilingual-bicultural college in the United States. McGeorge College of Law, an independent law school founded in Sacramento in 1924, amalgamated with the University in 1966 as its School of Law. The third cluster college, focusing on non-western studies and featuring a year of study in an Asian culture, began in 1967 as Callison College.

In the fall of 1977, Raymond and Callison Colleges merged to form a single school to provide intercultural and inter-disciplinary programs with the distinctive feature of a year of study in Japan. These programs were reorganized in the fall of 1979 under a Center for Integrated Studies and a Center for International Programs in the College of the Pacific.

Also in the fall of 1977 the Department of Business Administration of College of the Pacific was reorganized to become the School of Business and Public Administration.

Effective in the fall of 1982, Elbert Covell College has been reorganized as a non-degree granting program in Inter-American Studies in order to make its offerings more accessible to students throughout the University.

The University of the Pacific is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Senor Colleges and Universities of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

The University's 150-acre Stockton campus has over 80 academic and residential buildings, plus athletic facilities. Its co-educational student body has approximately 3.600 full time undergraduates, 6,000 on all three campuses, 70% from California, 30% from remaining states and abroad; 300 foreign students from 60 countries. Fall '81 entering class included

750 freshmen, 450 transfers. The Stockton campus has a faculty of approximately 275 full-time with over 75% having earned doctorates. The student-faculty ratio averages 13 to 1; 75% of our classes have 33 or fewer students.

The University has over 90 academic programs, including special, multiple, cross-disciplinary majors, and students may enroll in classes offered at any of the University's undergraduate schools or colleges.

The 1983-84 academic year saw the University on an early semester calendar: two fifteen week semesters, the first beginning the third week of August and concluding before Christmas holidays, the second beginning the third week of January with commencements in mid-May.

The University has approxiamtely 325,000 bound volumes in its Irving Martin Library, UOP's central facility; periodicals, microfilm, etc.

The University's athletic program is a member of the Pacific Coast
Athletic Association (PCAA); men compete in football, basketball, baseball,
tennis, swimming, golf, waterpolo, and soccer. For women's athletics, UOP
is a member of the Northern California Athletic Comference; women compete
in field hockey, basketball, softball, tennis, swimming, and volleyball.
The University has an extensive intramural program and physical education
activity courses. Facilities include a 35,000-seat stadium, 6,000-seat
Alex G. Spanos Center, gymnasium, tennis courts, and Olympic-size swimming
pool.

The University has 12 residence halls (eleven coed, one all women's), five fraternities, four sororities, and three University owned and operated apartment complexes, accommodating approximately 2,200 students and staff.



S.B.P.A. History

S.B.P.A. HISTORY

The School of Business and Public Administration is the newest professional school at the University of the Pacific. For several years the Department of Business was the largest in the College of the Pacific, UOP's liberal arts college. However, due to increasing demand for expansion of the business program, the School of Business and Public Administration opened its doors in September 1977.

Today, students have access not only to the facilities of the School of Business and Public Administration, but to the entire University. These include mathematics labs, the Academic Skills Center, and the University Computer Center.

The school offers two degree programs, one leading to the Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration, and the other leading to the Bachelor of Science degree in Public Administration.

These four-year programs consist of three interrelated segments: general education courses and electives, a common core of courses in the major, and specialized courses in the major.

General education requirements are met through the completion of four courses in the humanities; two social/behavioral sciences; two natural sciences, one of which must be a lab; and one course stressing advanced expository writing.

In addition, all Business majors must take a common core of courses dealing with specific functions of business such as accounting, economics, finance, marketing, law, statistics, and the environment of business. Similarly, Public Administration majors must take a common core of courses dealing with political science, economics, mathematics,

administrative law, public finance, and personnel.

As for concentration areas, at least four courses are required in the specialized area. In Business Administration the concentration fields are Accounting, Finance, General Business, International Management, Labor Relations, Marketing, and Personnel/Human Resources Administration. In Public Administration they are Conflict Management, Health and Human Services Administration, International Management, and Public Management.

Outside of the standard cirricula students may also participate in internships in the form of partime work arrangements made through the school with local businesses, government agencies, and industries. Moreover, students may also enroll in a number of independent study or independent research courses in their field of interest.

Clearly, the school is career oriented, yet it provides excellent preparation for advanced study in law, economics, international relations, government and political science. The visitation report from the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business states:

"Texts selected for core courses are deliberately chosen to be texts often used in major graduate schools in the area for the foundation course for MBA's. Alumni who have gone on for MBA degrees at the University of California—Berkeley and at Stanford have indicated the foundation work would be remedial given their background at UOP."

The quality of the program is further exemplified in the school's most recent triumph: AASCB accreditation at the earliest possible date.

The school's to date incredibly successful record can be explained very briefly: committed to excellence. And if past records are any indication, this devotion will carry the school well into the future.

History of Upsilon Pi

HISTORY OF THE UPSILON PI COLONY

The thought of starting a professional business fraternity at The University of the Pacific has been alive for about three years. It started when Bill Tatum of Delta Sigma Pi met our Dean, Dr. Elliot Kline, on a plane flight. At that point in time it would not have been proper to start a professional business fraternity at the university. The main reason for this was the size and youth of the School of Business and Public Administration. The School of Business and Public Administration at The University of the Pacific was founded in 1977, making it the youngest of the professional schools at U.O.P. It was in the spring of 1983 that the school was accredited by The American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business(AACSB). With this event came the indirect beginnings of Delta Sigma Pi at U.O.P.

The first informational, organizational meeting sponsored by The International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi was conducted in room 106 of Weber Hall. This meeting was held on Monday, October 3, 1983, for a select group of business students. The representatives of Delta Sigma Pi were Bill Tatum, Debbie Toso, and Paul Ritter.

It was at this meeting that Bill Tatum suggested that our group be named the Upsilon Pi Colony. This name was accepted by all, and it was the beginning of our venture to start a fraternity. On October 10, 1983 the colony held officer elections. The results were as follows:

From this date to the end of the semester, the colony concentrated on developing recognition on campus. This was done through banners announcing meetings and running an article in the student newspaper, THE PACIFICAN.

The executive council of the Upsilon Pi Colony runs the colony through a committee base. The committees include: Social, Faculty Relations, Community Service, Communications, Public Relations, Fund Raising, and several Ad Hoc committees. The executive council feels that it is extremely important to get all members involved in the activities of the colony. This is best done through an active committee structure. Delegation of authority but not of responsibility is the executive council's aim; it is a type of "the buck stops here" philosophy.

At the present time, the strength of our colony lies in the vast resources of its membership. This accounts for the excellance of the committees. Public Relations, Fund Raising, Social, and the Ad Hoc committees for Petition, Bylaws, and Professional Speakers have proven themselves to be the most effective committees.

Our fund raisers have included Christmas candy packages, which turned a profit of \$170. Presently, we are selling Valentine balloon gifts. This project has cleared the break even point and is clearly on its way to being another financial success.

Our professional speakers have been few, but excellent, as a whole. Paul Fairbrooks, Director of U.O.P. Auxillary Services, was our first speaker. He spoke to us on the importance of good public

relations, using college food services as an example. Our other speaker was Jerome Paolini, Vice President of the Corporate Trading Department at American Savings. Mr. Paolini, a 1981 S.B.P.A. graduate from U.O.P., spoke to us about the political structures of organizations and strategies to use when interviewing for your first job. Looking forward to February 29, 1984, the Upsilon Pi Colony will co-sponsor Donald K. White, Business Editor of the San Francisco Chronicle. Mr. White will speak on Entrepreneurship in the 1980's.

The Public Relations Committee has ordered shirts with the Greek letters Delta Sigma Pi on them. The shirts are optional for members. As a result of the shirts, Monday has been designated as both meeting and shirt day. The members of the colony demonstrated their enthusiasm for the fraternity when almost every member ordered at least one shirt. Also, this committee has been very effective in informing the campus community about our fund raising activities.

Currently, the Upsilon Pi Colony of Delta Sigma Pi is a growing and exciting organization. We have the ability to be the best, provided we learn from others' mistakes.


