Gentlemen:

In accomplishine this purpose, It assumes the responsibilities delegated to it by the Illinois General Assembly, the Boain of Higher Education and the Board of covernons of State Sollezes and Universities.

In carryinc out its instructional responsibilities, "estern places major emphasis on serving undereraduate sthdents.

In adeition to those entering freshman who quaify $y$ instim tutional admission standards, enollments at the junior and senior lovels are supplemented by students who have satis. factorily completed a colleae-jevel transfer program in a community college or have transferred from other two- or fow-year institutions.

The university also continues to provide for the instructional needs of a diverse graduate student body. These needs are served through expansion of off-camnus instructional. research, and servise activities in response to changing needs. As the cultural center for the recion, \#estern will increase its efforts to provide enriching ou?tural activities throurh prozrams in the performime and risual arts.

At the present time the college of Eusiness offers an undereraduate program with majors in acoountancy, administrative office management, economics, business education, personrel administration, operations manaqement, marketine, finance, transportation, and management. In adeition to these major areas, the wadergraduate program provides a sound foundation of studies in human behavior and quantitive skills, using statistics and research knowledce as a tool for decision making. Dach undergraduate student is introdueed to the computer in the freshman year, and uses it throughout his or her study in the college of Business.

The Colleqe of Business has been granted accreditation by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Eusiness, placing it amonest the top 15 percent of the nations more than 2000 schools of business. This accreditation has been eranta ad for both undergraduate and graduate levels. The Colleae of Business is an upper-aivision college with
majors seerine entry to junior and senior standing. Studants at the freshman and sophomore level are encolled as prebusiness majors. hocertance as an upper-level major in the Collace of Business requires the completion fo at least 60 semester hours with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50. Dach stucent must also have completed accountancy 242 and 242 , computer science 102, quantitative analysis 210, aconomics 231 and 232 , and mathematies 137 and 138 or 139. Iransfer students must meet these requirements before acceptance into a Colla天̃e of Business program, A total of 120 semester hours of crediti is required for the Bachelor of Business degree. The last 30 credit hours must be taken at Western. The Collere of Euchness is prow of its well qualified faculty and their wide range of professional skills and experiences, Presently they have doctoral or law degrees from over 40 fnternationally recognized universitiies. The faculties asademic, professional. practical, and research background, as well as its continuine involvement in attempting to solve contemporasy business and community problems enhances tile quality of the classroom experience.
