About The University of Louisville



History of The University of Louisville

The University of Louisville was founded in 1798 when eight community leaders stated that for Louisville, as a community, to be a place of "some consequence" it needed an institution of higher education. Those individuals called upon their fellow citizens to join them in pledging funds for land, buildings, and teachers, which created the Jefferson Seminary, the precursor to the University of Louisville. In 1829, the Jefferson Seminary was forced to close due to pressures from newly established public schools and media critiquing it as an "elitist." However, eight years later, in 1837, the Louisville City council established the Louisville Medical Institute and the Louisville Collegiate Institute was established soon after in 1840. These schools were combined in 1846 along with a newly created law school, which caused the whole university to flourish. In 1923, the school purchased what is today known as the Belknap Campus, where the liberal arts programs and law school stand with the medical campus remaining downtown. In 1970, for primarily financial reasons, the University of Louisville became part of the Kentucky higher education system. It was not until the Kentucky General Assembly enacted the Postsecondary Education Reform Act of 1997 (the "Reform") that the University of Louisville received a defined statutory mandate to become a "premier nationally recognized metropolitan research university."

The University of Louisville is a state supported research university located in Kentucky's largest metropolitan area. It was a municipally supported public institution for many decades prior to



joining the university system in 1970. The University has three campuses. The 287-acre Belknap Campus is three miles from downtown Louisville and houses seven of the university's 12 colleges and schools. The Health Sciences Center is situated in downtown Louisville's medical complex and houses the university's health related programs and the University of Louisville Hospital. The 243-acre Shelby Campus is the last of these locations and is located in eastern Jefferson County.

The University of Louisville takes pride in its achievements and awards, which are obtained through the hard work and dedication of its students. With "The Year of the Cardinal," in 2013, the Louisville Cardinals became the first university ever to win a BCS Bowl game, place both Men's and Women's Basketball teams in the NCAA Final Four and reach the College World Series. In the year 2014, The University of Louisville became the newest member of the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC), which was a major accomplishment for the school.

Now, under the leadership of its seventeenth president, James R. Ramsey, the University of Louisville has become known especially for teaching, research, and service to its community and the advancement of educational opportunity for all citizens thereof. With an enrollment of 22,298 students and faculty members of 6,859, its academic programs attract students from every state and from all over the world. The average ACT score is currently 25.0 and enrollment increases from year to year. It is well positioned to fulfill the mission assigned to it by the state legislature: to become "a premier, nationally-recognized metropolitan research university."



About The College of Business



History of The College of Business

Founded in 1953 the University of Louisville College of Business has developed from a local commuter school to a nationally recognized university for its achievements on both a graduate and undergraduate level. The school prides itself on emphasizing "a business degree for the real world" and useful many resources to fully prepare its students. This comes from the schools focus on internships and study abroad programs that allow students to experience aspects of business in a practical way. This helps the university take a strong academic curriculum and turn it in to applicable business knowledge.

The Business school has increased its standards to the point were it is the most selective school at the university by requiring a minimum 2.8 GPA for students and certain classes to be completed before enrollment. This standard is also the highest among all universities, public or private, in the region. The schools programs are accredited by the Association for the Advancement of Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), and include: Accountancy, Computer Information Systems, Economics, Entrepreneurship, Equine Business, Finance, Management, Marketing, and other Business Certificates. The school has been particularly been recognized for its high ranked and highly selective Entrepreneurship Programs.

Some notable alumni include James Patterson founder of Long John Silvers and Rally's brands, David Jones founder of Humana, and many other local business leaders. Among these are two recent



alumni recognized on Forbes Magazine's national 40 under 40 ranking. Through the Ulmer Career Center, the university provides students with networking opportunities with this extensive list of alumni. The center also offers career preparatory events, information, and other personal help such as mock interviews and resume help.

The College of Business has great resources, faculty, and professors in order to successfully prepare its students for life after college. The opportunities granted at this college are immense and continue to expand each and every day.



About the Louisville Colony



UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE

History of the Colony

In the 2014 Spring Semester Professor Jay Brandi reached out to the current President, Stacia Bivens, about starting up a Delta Sigma Pi Colony at the University of Louisville. He explained how there was a colony active many years ago, but it never got past the colonization process and him, being an alumni of Delta Sigma Pi, wanted to see a chapter established at the University. After some communication with other friends in the College of Business who were eager to start a colony as well, we all began to plan and work on the colonization process. Stacia and the other interested students, Kelsey Kennedy and Rachael Bivens, completed and signed the Formal Letter of Intent on March 21, 2014. They were able to set up a couple meetings with the Regional Vice President, Erin Lee, about the steps and requirements that were needed to complete the colonization process.

On April 10, 2014, the first informal interest meeting of the Delta Sigma Pi Colony at the University of Louisville was hosted by Stacia Bivens. About forty students came to this interest meeting to hear more about Delta Sigma Pi and what the fraternity had to offer. Officers were elected and various meetings were held throughout the summer to plan for the future semesters and colonization process. The Louisville Colony of Delta Sigma Pi was approved as a recognized student organization (RSO) at the University of Louisville and was able to begin regular meetings and activities. Our first formal, bi-weekly meetings began in the 2014 Fall Semester on September 11, 2014 and were most often held on Thursdays from 12:15pm-1:00pm. Officer meetings were held on Tuesdays before colony meetings ranging from 12:15pm-1:00pm. Colony business



included officer reports where the colony members were updated on upcoming professional, community service, fundraising, and social events as well as other colony announcements.

All officers and members actively participated in meetings and events put on by the colony and demonstrated a good faith effort in the intent to establish a collegiate chapter of Delta Sigma Pi at the University of Louisville. After hosting eight professional events, six community service events, and recruiting a minimum of twenty-five members, a collegiate chapter of Delta Sigma Pi at the University of Louisville was ready to be formed.

Colony Events

April 10, 2014 - April 6, 2015

The Louisville Colony had a total of twenty meetings throughout the Fall and Spring Semesters. Our first interest meeting was held on April 10, 2014 in order to gauge interest for the coming semesters and elect officers to make plans over the summer. We began our official start as a colony in the 2014 Fall Semester where we had colony meetings every other Thursday from 12:15pm-1:00pm. As we began the 2015 Spring Semester we decided it would be best for the colony and our members to change the meetings to a later time and make the length of them longer. We currently have meetings Monday evenings from 6:00pm-7:00pm where we give officer reports, announce important event information, plan for future meetings and events, and bond as Brothers of the Fraternity.

October 9, 2014: Professor Garret

Professor Garret teaches Entrepreneurship at the University of Louisville and spoke to our members about the significance of this major and how vital it is in many employments. He described in more depth what entrepreneurship was entirely about and the benefits and opportunities it contained. We reached out to the whole student body of the College of Business with this event in order to advertise our colony and event and thirty-seven members were in attendance.



October 23, 2014: Monroe Shine & Co.

Monroe Shine is a local accounting firm who had several staff speak to the members of the Louisville Colony about their firm, the importance of interning, and preparing for the CPA exam. Twenty colony members were present during this event and were able to learn more about this firm other career opportunities that are out there.

October 25, 2014: Brook lawn



Four members of the Louisville Colony and a few members of the Kappa Psi Chapter met at the Brook lawn Child Care Services to volunteer with children who are suffering from abuse and mistreatment within their homes. We interacted with the kids and played a couple games including kick ball. We were there for



around three hours and were able to interact with the children and the Kappa Psi Chapter.

October 30, 2014: Professor Hartung

Professor Hartung is a Marketing Professor at the University of Louisville who was also a member of Delta Sigma Pi at another university. He spoke to members on the topic "How to sell in an interview" where he covered the basic do's and don'ts of interviewing.

November 6, 2014: Buca de Beppo

The whole colony participated in promoting this fundraising event where we got 15% of the total checks from anyone who ate at Buca de Beppo from 5:00pm-10:00pm and handed our flyer to their server. A big group of us went to the restaurant together and we were able to raise a total of \$300.00 from this fundraising event and outside donations.

November 13, 2014: Northwestern Mutual

Lauren Beecher spoke to the members of the Louisville Colony about a personality test and the benefits, opportunities, and internships Northwestern Mutual offers. Prior to the event, members attending were asked to answer a set of various questions provided by Lauren in order to assess our personality skills and traits. At the event, she printed out reports for each member who participated which analyzed what kind of personality we had, the jobs that suited us, who we did and did not get along with, etc. Twenty members were present at this event and it was interesting to learn more about



our personality and the type of individual we are and how we interact with others.

November 15, 2014: Opal's Dream Foundation Gala



Opal's Dream Foundation is a non-profit organization aimed at providing help and care to nursing home residents with little money or family present. This organization puts on a Gala every year to raise money and honor their donors and beneficiaries who have contributed to their organization's success. Five members volunteered on a Saturday night from 5:00pm-11:00pm and helped with the set-up and tear down of the event as well as manning the auction booths for the whole night. It was great to hear Opal's story



and how this organization has affected and changed the lives of so many nursing home residents across the Louisville area.

November 21, 2014: TQL Tour



TQL is a third party logistics provider who specializes in domestic freight transportation and logistics services to various customers. It is currently the second largest freight brokerage firm in North America and we got the opportunity to tour their newly built Louisville office as well as shadows a couple professionals, participate in a selling competition, and ask any questions we had. The event lasted from 10:00am-1:00pm and three members were



present. This event was focused on providing members with a different view of the multiple career paths that are available in the world.

December 14, 2014: Ronald McDonald House



February 3, 2015: LinkedIn Workshop








Association; Myers-Briggs Type Indicator®; Predictive Index® Analyst; and StrengthsQuest® analyst through the Clifton Strengths School.


