 - a. Based on everyone's inputs, we will vote on this proposal next spring at the provincial LEAD.
 - b. VPOD Description: this position is overlapped by many other positions; many people don't exactly know what this position entails.
 - i. The right change to this position would be to eliminate it
 - ii. We should have short term strategic plans that are changed every 2 years. Our long term strategic plan is our purpose
 - c. Question: By removing the position, does it change the voting process structure? Eliminating this position, we will only 9 voters, so there won't ever be even split. In the past, if it were even, the Grand President would vote to break the even votes.
 - d. Question: What are the expectations of Board Members? This will save about \$4,000 by eliminating this position. Committee chairs are volunteers with no political issues.
 - e. OD committee chair should still exist, just remove the VP position
 - f. Question (Epsilon Upsilon): Why create a new position to eliminate an old position?
 - g. Question (Matt Temple, South Pac RVP): Speak more to the number of votes on the board. Maybe add an Information Systems position to modernize our databases.
 - h. Question (Dave, Desert Mountain RVP): Shouldn't be the Grand President's role to appoint someone because the person should truly be what everyone votes for and has a say in.

LEAD School:

Reno LEAD School was a success with about 240 attendees making up 70% of the province's chapters. We had Adam Caroll as the key note speaker and quite a few different presenters then the normal crew. We conducted two community service events, Dress Down and Make a Difference Make a Drop with a net profit from both of approximately \$400. The province also endowed a new scholarship fund, The Western PVP scholarship where proceeds will go to outset the registration cost of Provincial Conference. 13 chapters made their donation to become Legacy Chapters in Reno which met the challenge of 12 chapters and made me get up and sing 8 songs in closing session. Over \$4,000 was raised for the Leadership Foundation.

La Jolla sold out after the early deadline with nearly 500 registrations. With some logistical changes, the hotel is able to accommodate 550. Currently, 82% of the colligate chapters are registered and we are hopeful that almost all will be registered by the next deadline. We plan on having a dance both nights with a pirate theme on Saturday and other special surprises. There will be three community services, Letter to Troops, Make a Difference ,Make a Drop with proceeds going to a cancer foundation in honor of Nancie Glanzrock, and a poker tournament put on by the Inland Empire Alumni Chapter. The alumni committee has chosen two sessions specifically for alumni to attend in the afternoon.

Expansion:

Pepperdine was installed in November and Concordia is targeting an installation date of 4/21. The University of Hawaii at Manoa is rebooting with the current president being a Brother. Dale Clark will be paying them a visit in the upcoming semester. Chapman is getting started and will focus on recruiting when school is back in session.

Other schools that we are targeting and/or have interested are: University of Idaho, University of Washington, Southern Oregon University, CSU Dominguez Hills, CSU San Bernardino and CSU San Marcos.

Regional Vice President Report

Status

Most chapters in the region are on track to be 100% accredited. Those who are not are really behind in their events. Morale in most of the chapters is high.
